Community Investment Program

The Bridgetown Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade now has a new welfare vehicle thanks to a \$138,000 donation from Talison's Community Investment Program (CIP). The Ford Ranger 4WD, equipped with a purpose-built canopy, will provide essential amenities like tea, coffee, water and snacks at forward control points during emergencies.

It will also distribute meals to emergency volunteers and can tow the existing welfare trailer, expanding its reach during incidents.

I had the great pleasure of being provided a rundown of vehicle by Bridgetown Volunteer Bushfire Brigade Captain Millie Nedelkovski who explained to me how the welfare vehicle has ability to provide both rapid response and support at a second location during incidents with deployment of their existing welfare trailer.

I'm also proud to share an update on the significant contribution Talison has made to Bridgetown Primary School through the CIP. Talison recently provided \$141,742, to assist the school in enhancing their playground facilities for students of all ages. They have since purchased six (6) pieces of new play equipment, including a large play module specifically designed for children aged four to six years old. Additionally, the funding has helped purchase and install two (2) new water drinking fountains, a picnic table, seating and audio-visual equipment in the undercover assembly area. Recently I was provided a tour of the new facilities and was pleased to see how the improvements are benefiting students' physical, social and emotional wellbeing.

The four pillars of Talison's CIP are:

- · Health and Wellbeing; and
- Vibrant & Sustaining communities.

David Ayers: A Journey from Suffolk to Balingup

David was born in Suffolk England in 1934 where his parents were farming. He had three older siblings Jean born in Jan 1929, Tom born in Dec 1929 and Pat born in 1931.

Their farm was a poultry farm raising chickens and selling eggs and times were tough going through the depression,

The 2nd World War started when David was five, food was scarce, there was no feed for the chickens and they had to be disposed of.

He attended a small village school with one teacher who was not very well qualified as the war had taken many people away to work in the war, however she was very capable with reading, writing and arithmetic.

The Ayers farm was in the boundary of an American bomber base, a pretty exciting thing for a young boy!

When the war was over and David was at High School, talk was of opportunities in Australia. His father Harry Leslie Ayers, had gone to Australia aged 17, to work around for two years, then in 1914 he enlisted in the First World War and lost an arm at Gallipoli He had always wanted to return to Australia, so in 1949 it was decided the family would immigrate.

The family had grown, Peter was born in 1941 and Paul in 1948 completing the family of six children.

It was decided that his father and the two older boys Tom and Pat together with their Grandfather Henry who was in a wheelchair, along with his sister Ruby who cared for him would go first to establish a home and property in Australia. They sailed on the Strathaird.

The rest would follow in 1950, that would include their mother Mary Louise Ayers, Grandmother Harriet Jane Cook, Jean, David, Peter and Paul. They boarded the Ormonde in November 1950. In the meantime a large home "Eulomo" had been acquired 3km from Balingup on Jayes Road where our large extended family settled. The property had a dairy and large apple and pear orchard, eventually employing several people to pack the fruit.

In 1950 Balingup was a very busy town. Most were younger people, many returned from the war. There were many dairy farms; most had apple orchards, so the two packing sheds in town being Patterson's and Wesfarmers were very busy and the cheese factory as well. Several timber mills operated and the railway saw several steam trains every day.

Balingup had a Station Master and assistant, the Post Office had several girls manning the telephone exchange with many of us having share lines or "party lines" only answering when our special ring was heard. The Post Master was still sending telegrams by Morse code.

The town had two stores, a butcher shop, baker, Bank of New South Wales and the Commercial Bank visited twice a week.



The hotel was busy with a front bar for the men and lounge for the women, and the tea rooms was especially busy on Thursday nights when the pictures were on.

There was a large pig sale building and cattle sale yards with loading facilities and yards at the railway. Forestry towns at East Kirup (later called Grimwade), Lewana and Kirup were thriving and as there were few cars a truck was provided to bring people to town and the pictures.

Balingup had three football teams, A, B and a junior team as had all the surrounding towns. As we were all very tall we were sought after by the local team. Tennis and bowls were thriving in summer and badminton and hockey were played in winter.

There was no television in those days until around 1962 and around 1965 a drive in cinema was built in Bridgetown.

These were the good times, badminton was quite a new sport then and had been introduced by Mrs Cox who coached many players and was a champion player at the club along with Mr McLaughlin and the Mauger's. This was held of an evening and after milking, all wearing our 'whites' we would head off to the Town Hall for a game. David was very good at all ball/racquet sports and went on to become a state badminton player. There was the local CWA, RSL Club, Church, Rifle Range, and maroning in the Blackwood River. Dances were held every Saturday night at a close venue; music was supplied by the local Black and White Band which every young person followed.

Tennis was a very social event every Sunday, founding members were William's, Wauchope's, Maidment's, Dowrick's, Percival's, David Le Jeune, Kesner's, Wright's and Mauger's. Every summer a large tennis tournament was held in Balingup and on the Saturday night a tennis ball (dance) would be held with dancing until 2am. Other organisations such as the Catholic Church and Agricultural Show all held balls to raise money. There was always an annual Debutante Ball held in Balingup for the young ladies. There was not much money but everyone was happy.

CWA provided many services, since taken over by the government and the Agricultural Department had advisors who regularly visited the farms.

There was a Wesfarmers Co-Op & Hardware and Elders Stock Agent company. Electricity was provided by Davidsons Garage. Petrol came in 44 gallon drums. Rabbits were a curse but 1080 poison and eventually myxomatosis and other viruses got them under control.

Unfortunately dairy products and apples fell on bad times in the late sixties and life changed for-


The Forestry Department bought the Eulomo property and after a five year free lease, sadly the beautiful big old home was demolished. This was located opposite the current 'Bossy Boots Farm' along Jayes Road which back then was owned by John & Betty Mauger who of course became very close friends.



David got his drivers licence on 23rd June 1952, issued by Constable ED Wear at the Police Station in Greenbushes which is now Room 5 (the library) at Greenbushes Primary School. He still has it today, 70 years later.

The Ayers family ran the Greenbushes Butcher Shop. Chilla Wilson was the main slaughter man and Ayers brothers Tom and Pat were main ones involved. The butcher shop closed sometime around 1965, the population was very low, the shop was demolished and block was unsaleable. In later years, a local family did build another butcher shop and the building still stands on Blackwood Road.

In the fifty's rabbits over ran the farms and the trapper from our farm Colin Fulford, could catch 100 to 200 a night. These were picked up daily by truck and taken to cool store in Greenbushes. Mostly payment in cash was left under a log.



David married Wendy Hutchinson and they lived on the Ayers family's 'Yungerup' property in Balingup which is now known as 'The Golden Valley Tree Park'. The Forestry Department eventually purchased this property and David & Wendy just managed to purchase a farm on Papalias Road in 1972 which they called 'Newyungerup' where they ran cattle and sheep. At this stage they had a son Trevor who was born in 1971. In 1973 they had a daughter Louise.

Although the 'Newyungerup' property is just within the Balingup boundary, the Greenbushes school bus passed right by the farm gate so all school activities were related to Greenie while sporting, postal and a majority of social activities were still carried out in Balingup.

Up until the mid 80's when the Railway Station closed, they used to load their lambs and wool onto the rail carriages in North Greenbushes. After it closed, only wood chips were sent by rail. David then had to transport the sheep to Boyup Brook for sale and the wool was sent by road.

In 2005, they moved over the road from 'Newyungerup' to 'Illilluwa' an adjoining part of the farm so that their daughter Louise & son-in-law Jason could take over the running of the farm. At the ripe old age of 89 and 87, David and Wendy moved to live at the 'Vintage' units in Balingup.

David turned 90 on 14th March 2024 and is still very social and involved, particularly with the Balingup Bowling Club.

They have many friends from these good old days still living in Balingup, Greenbushes, Bridgetown and Donnybrook.

The Greenbushes Railway Station relocation

Friday 8th March 2024 was a wonderful day for the preservation of the Greenbushes Railway Station with its relocation from North Greenbushes to be part of the Greenbushes Discovery Centre.



Some history regards the relocation......The rail line opened

up in 1898 with the last passenger service in 1985. and the last goods train being a woodchip from Diamond Mill passing through Greenbushes when the line was closed in 2005.

The Greenbushes Ratepayers & Residents Association was still keen to preserve the building and had a Statement of Cultural Significance prepared on the facility in 1994 to assist the group get support from the Shire to preserve the building or to obtain funds itself to preserve the building.

This group successfully lobbied PTA (Public Transport Authority) to lease the facility to the Bridgetown-Greenbushes Shire in 1995 so as to ensure it was not demolished. PTA had no interest in the building and did not want its liability.

The railway station fell into disrepair and was seriously vandalised on numerous occasions, and was made safe but was never used again. The Greenbushes Ratepayers & Residents Association did look at a number of options with various businesses including as a showroom for the Whitakers Timber Mill value added products and it was also considered a potential showroom for the Greenbushes Stallwoods Furniture factory when it was in operation at the Mill site. However, connecting services and refurbishing the facility to make it usable was expensive, however getting permission from PTA to use this facility while in that location was problematic.

It seemed that it would be impossible to get permission to use this facility for any purpose at this location and in addition the facility was remote and continually subject to vandalism. There was no other group interested in retaining its history and the Shire had little interest as it was already involved in trying to refurbish and find a use for the Bridgetown Station.

The Greenbushes Ratepayers & Residents group did not get much support from the Heritage Council who did not see any National or State significance in the building as it was decreed that there were sufficient buildings of this era built by the same architect in better quality still around and in use.

In 2003 the Station masters house adjacent to the Station burned to the ground due to an alleged electrical fault.



To try and preserve the building in the interim a busy bee was held by the Greenbushes Ratepayers & Residents Association to fix some of the weather boards being eaten by white ants, put up boards to close off the doors of the front entrance that were vandalised and replaced various locks and doors on the rear of the building. In addition, the Masonite walls were removed as they were riddled with white ants.

Again in 2003 The Greenbushes Ratepayers & Residents and Association managed to coordinate a Restoration Project in association with the Curtain University & Sir Charles Court "Young Leaders Programme", the Bridgetown Greenbushes Shire, Sons of Gwalia and other local businesses where the facility had some stumps replaced, further termite treatment, some of the roof short sheets and weatherboards were repaired or replaced. The facility was also repainted externally.

Unlike the Balingup Railway Station which was bulldozed and disposed of at the Balingup tip by the PTA in approximately 1975 without the community being engaged the Discovery Centre was keen to find a way to preserve and find a use for the facility. In 2010 the Greenbushes Discovery Centre developed a Business Plan to relocate the facility from the current site to behind the Greenbushes Discovery Centre to be used as the "Heritage" display. Approval was gained from PTA to relocate the station with a number of conditions mainly related to the condition of the old railway station site.

Brookfield Rail who currently leases the infrastructure from the Department of Transport also supported this project. Difficulties in raising funds, identifying a cost-effective relocation contractor, COVID delays and significant prices increases resulted in the project being deferred on numerous occasions.

Eventually with the assistance of the Shire and significant grant monies the relocation of the Greenbushes Railway station was on again as part of the Railway Station project which included refurbishing the Bridgetown Railway Station for use as the Visitor Centre.

The relocation includes the refurbishment of the facility to lock-up stage.

The building is now located at the rear of the Discovery Centre and should assist in minimising vandalism.

Funding is now being sought to develop the facility as the interactive Heritage Display and

a gallery for displaying and possibly selling local artwork.

In addition, the Discovery Centre is planning to erect

information panels depicting the history of the Station, the

railway, Timber Mill along with other local history with the erection of cutout figures and the original Goods crane.

This site also forms part of the New Zeeland Gully Walk Trail.



Balingup Primary School may be small, but it is the hub of the wider Balingup Community. Many children of local settlers, going back many generations, have been supported and nurtured within these school walls.

Two of the present - day institutions of nurture at the school are mentoring of students and Breakfast Club, both of which promote the emotional and physical needs of the individual.

The Mentoring Program is run by an outside agency, EdConnect, which is approved by the Education Department and costs \$400 annually for membership. Breakfast Club has been running many years at Balingup PS with outstanding contributions of food from FoodBank and a weekly band o staff and parent volunteers. As with all things, there are continuing costs involved which are not covered by the generosity of FoodBank. At present, these costs amount to approximately \$1200 annually, which equates to \$1 per child per meal.

To cover the shortfall in finances we would like to open the way for families/local groups/businesses/corporations to sponsor an amount each term. These amounts would be receipted by the school and each sponsor would be listed in our three- weekly school newsletter.



nbn Fixed Wireless network upgrades in Greenbushes and Balingup starting soon

Work has continued on upgrades to the **nbn** Fixed Wireless network in the south west, with work to upgrade the Greenbushes tower getting underway next month. The upgrade will benefit households and businesses across the south west, providing faster speeds and extending the coverage of the **nbn** Fixed Wireless network.

The \$750 million investment in the **nbn** Fixed Wireless and **nbn** Sky Muster satellite network - \$480 million from the Australian Government and \$270 million from **nbn** – is on track to be completed by December 2024.

When complete, the investment will expand the reach of the existing **nbn** Fixed Wireless footprint by up to 50%, as well as enabling two new high speed fixed wireless plans – Fixed Wireless Home Fast and Fixed Wireless Superfast. The additional capacity and reach available on the upgraded network will also enable approximately 120,000 existing Sky Muster satellite-only premises to access **nbn** Fixed Wireless for the first time.

Work has begun to enable the upgrades, including **nbn** introducing new technology and replacing some hardware on our fixed wireless towers.

The tower upgrades will mean some planned outages that may impact homes and businesses and their ability to use their **nbn** service while the work is underway. **nbn** will take all reasonable efforts to minimise service interruptions, however there are occasions where towers will be taken offline.

The upgrade work is scheduled to begin next month on the Greenbushes town tower, with work on the North Greenbushes and Balingup towers to occur in the weeks following. The tower works will not impact **nbn** Sky Muster satellite services.

Impacted homes and businesses should be notified of any outages via their retail service provider.







Naomi Evans, head of nbn Local WA said: "There is ever increasing demand for faster internet from homes and businesses across Australia and we are continuing to invest in the **nbn** network to stay ahead of demand.

"We are excited to soon commence work upgrading the **nbn** Fixed Wireless network in the Shires of Bridgetown-Greenbushes and Donnybrook-Balingup, which will be a game changer for up to a million households and businesses across Australia.

"These tower works are critical to the delivery of our program but will mean some planned outages that may affect homes and businesses and their ability to use their **nbn** service while the work is underway. After the tower works are completed, we expect that faster download speeds during the busy period will become available across the **nbn** Fixed Wireless network.

"We are asking the community to prepare for these outages and have back up connectivity if they need it.

"We encourage people to check the **nbn** website and watch out for communication from their retail service provider about how the planned outages may impact them."

To get the benefits of the upgrades, homes and businesses may also need to update the **nbn** device at their premises. **nbn** will contact those impacted directly. Not all devices will need to be replaced.

Whitefly woes

In the intricate world of plant pests, whitefly, from the family Aleyrodidae, have a misleading name, given they are not flies at all. Instead, they belong to the order Hemiptera, sharing kinship with other sap sucking insect pests like aphids, scale, and mealybugs.

In their juvenile form the nymphs bear a resemblance to scale, while in their adult stage they take on the appearance of small moths. The only part of their name that is accurate, is the 'white'. This is particularly obvious when adult whiteflies are abruptly disturbed and take flight. The result is a large white plume or cloud of these tiny insects around their host plant. This behaviour is often referred to as 'flushing'.

Biology and lifecycle

Whiteflies are a tiny insect with a rapid and prolific lifecycle. Females lay between 30 to 40 near-microscopic eggs on the underside of leaves. Upon hatching, the 0.3 mm nymphs actively seek a feeding spot. Once found, they stay put, feeding, and moulting until their final form reaches 1 mm. The nymph then transforms into a winged adult, approximately 1.5 to 2.5 mm in size, completing the lifecycle in about one month. In spring and autumn, this lifecycle may be completed in as little as 18 days for some species. This efficient reproduction results in multiple overlapping generations each year, making the management of whitefly populations challenging.

Whiteflies are not fussy eaters and have a broad host range of horticultural plants including tropical fruits, citrus, and solanaceous vegetables, plus many omamental species, trees, and weeds. They are relatively weak flyers and rely on wind and human assistance for transportation, hitching rides on clothing, gardening equipment, and plant material. Three of five important species of whitefly in Western Australia were introduced this way. The other two, citrus whitefly and the native strain of Bemisia tabaci, are both native to Australia.

Impacts and management

Like other sap sucking insect pests, feeding damage caused by whitefly, in both its adult and nymph stages, can result in cell or leaf death (necrosis), impacting plant growth. Certain whitefly species are also able to transmit plant viruses. Virus symptoms include irregular ripening in tomatoes and blanching in carrots and broccoli.

The key to effective whitefly management is early detection. Check the upper surface of leaves for signs of feeding damage such as yellow mottling, silvering, wilting, curling, or distortion and check the underside of leaves for a sticky excretion (known as honeydew) or sooty mould. If found in the early stages, whiteflies can be reduced by removing infested leaves, hosing down with water, or even vacuuming (suitable for pot plants). If insecticides are needed, there are a range of products available. If treating vegetables or fruit trees, ensure you read the label and abide by any withholding periods. For most products, repeated treatments will be required, and remember to pay special attention to the undersides of those leaves!
