CRAIG'S CORNER— with Craig Dawson

As we progress further into 2024 at the Greenbushes Lithium Operation (Mine, Greenbushes), I'd like to acknowledge that, as you may have heard, short-term lithium market conditions have witnessed a marked downward trend in recent months. Whilst this may prompt a few adjustments in the Mine's short-term plans, I want to emphasise that the long-term outlook for the lithium market remains unchanged. Greenbushes is resilient, and well positioned to weather the current market fluctuations. I am confident Greenbushes will continue in 2024 to lead in lithium, just as it has successfully done for the past 40 years.

Dust Monitor Location Change

Talison is continually evolving its approach to actively manage dust emissions. Current mitigation measures include minimising bare dust generating surfaces, using surface stabilisation techniques such as non-toxic glues, spraying of water on haul roads, covered conveyors and final goods stockpiles, telescopic chutes on crusher discharge points and use of sweepers to clean up spillage.

As part of ongoing efforts, Talison has installed a new dust monitor on the Greenbushes Primary School Oval near Telluride Street. This monitor provides real-time, five-minute averaged dust levels within the Greenbushes townsite, following Australian Standards. The goal is to offer a representative sample of dust impacts on the community. The monitor's location was agreed upon with the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) as part of an approved Trigger Action Response Plan (TARP) implemented by Talison in mid-December. The TARP aims to significantly enhance dust monitoring and management practices at the Mine.





If the dust levels exceed the acceptable limits for an extended period, Talison may have to consider temporarily suspending some of its operational activities until Talison can effectively manage and reduce the dust

Record production

The Mine achieved a remarkable milestone by setting a new annual concentrate production record in 2023, surpassing the 2022 production record, with a total of 1.522 million tonnes produced. This outstanding outcome stands as a testament to the dedication and hard work of the Mine's entire workforce throughout 2023.

Presentation to Blackwood Chamber of Commerce and Industry

I look forward to sharing with local businesses how they can be involved in our procurement process in an upcoming presentation to the Blackwood Chamber of Commerce on 11 March. This will be a great opportunity to share how Talison is committed to supporting local businesses through procurement, all the while ensuring the availability of sufficient services and resources for the ongoing sustainability of the towns surrounding the Mine.

Photo of the year

Talison's survey team plays an important role in monitoring Mine operations and contributing to external drone footage. In 2023, their exceptional images led to the creation of a Photo of the Year competition. I had the privilege of being on the judging panel and extend my thanks to the team for their fantastic work. Congratulations to Steve Ayling for winning the 2023 Photo of the Year with his impressive image capturing Talison's Balga relocation program.



THE CITY OF ALBANY COMMEMORATES

AUSTRALIAN DEFENCE FORCE OPERATIONAL SERVICE SINCE 1973.

On 18 February 2024 the Albany Sub branch of the RSLWA held an inaugural service to commemorate and recognise Australian Defence Force service over the past 50 years. This includes service in many conflict areas such as Somalia, Rwanda, East Timor, Iraq, Afghanistan, and also includes Peace Keeping Operations such as Bougainville, Solomons and Timor Leste.

The memorial also honours the service of countless members who serviced in both full time and part time roles within Australia, and on constant navel patrols with Operation Sovereign Borders, as well as the 20,000 + members who undertook 3 month rotations at the Butterworth Airbase, providing security to RAAF interests in Malaysia.

79 members of the Australian Defence Force lost their lives during these operations.

70th Anniversary Celebrations

Bunbury will celebrate the 70th anniversary of the establishment of the first "boys only" school in the city during a weekend of events in April;.

Although it only lasted two decades as a single sex school, Marist Brothers college later morphed into what is now known at the Bunbury Catholic College.

Established on the outskirts of town on an old dairy farm known as Sandridge Park, the college in its relatively short history, educated a number of promi-

nent contributors to the city and country in business and political roles. Among them were four members of State (David Smith, John Castrilli, Jim Mc Ginty, Chris Back) and Federal Parliament (Geoff Prosser) and three Mayors of the City of Bunbury. (David Smith, John Castrilli, Gary Brennan). Added to that five former students have been recognised for

their contribution to their communities by being awarded Order of Australia Medals (John Castrilli, Peter Johnson, John Lally, Michael Smith, David Smith)

When the college opened in February 1954 there were just four class rooms shared by 96 students. Just eight students sat for their Junior Examination. Today the co-educational college boasts around 1250 students.

Established during an era of austerity, much of the early infrastructure was undertaken

on a voluntary basis as the country was recovering from World War II. Many of the early students were the children of migrants who had escaped the perils of war-torn Europe.

For a number of years a group of ex-Students have organised regular re-unions for ex-students and as this group is now entering their twilight years, a decision has been made to culminate these events with a final reunion to be held in **Bunbury on Saturday, April 13**, followed with a nostalgic visit to the present college the following day.



Ex-students from across Australia have already indicated their intention to converge on Bunbury for the swansong weekend.


















Balingup Small Farm Field Day 2024 - Where Nature Thrives
