Economic Contribution Update

Talison Lithium (**Talison**) is proud of its track record in actively supporting local initiatives through sponsorships and donations, yet its significant economic contributions often remain under the radar. It might even surprise some that in 2023, Talison ranked among Australia's largest corporate taxpayers.

In 2023, Talison paid a total of \$3.277 Billion to Local, State and Federal Governments and Government agencies, including:

- \$2.662 billion in Australian Government income tax;
- \$577 million in royalties, taxes and levies to the Western Australian (WA) Government; and
- \$791,201 in Local Government rates and fees.

- **Partnerships:** \$336,300, including contributions such as \$200,000 to Blackwood Youth Action, \$50,000 to Greenbushes Primary School and \$30,000 to Foodbank WA; and
- STEM and Indigenous Education Scholarships: \$45,000, available to students in 10 local schools.

Talison takes immense pride in the significant economic contributions stemming from its Greenbushes Lithium Operation (Site, Mine). \$2.254 Million For Bridgetown-Greenbushes Through Partnering For The Future Program

I was pleased to recently announce the projects funded through the 2024 Partnering for the Future program. This collaborative program with the Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes will see an investment of \$2.254 million from Talison aimed at enhancing community infrastructure, civic buildings, recreational areas and youth spaces.

Working closely with the Shire, Talison has again prioritised the continued delivery of the Greenbushes Transformation Plan specifically to fund enhancements to public amenities, parks, sporting facilities, footpaths, roads and drainage.

Bridgetown will benefit from funds for the installation of air conditioning and state-of-the-art audio-visual equipment in the Bridgetown Town Hall, as well as the development of engaging interpretive displays in the soon to be relocated Bridgetown Visitor Centre, located within the newly restored Bridgetown Railway Station, and an energy sustainability project which will see the installation of solar panels and batteries on civic buildings in Bridgetown.



A component of the funding will be used for Project Management which ensures the Shire has the capacity and resources to deliver the Partnering for the Future 2024 initiatives. For a full list of projects funded visit talisonlithium.com/news.

The Partnering for the Future program is funded through the Talison CIP, which was introduced in 2023 and provides larger investment opportunities for Local Government and community organisations to deliver strategic projects across the categories of quality education, sustainable environments and biodiversity improvements, health and wellbeing and vibrant and sustaining communities.

New Parental Leave Guideline

At Talison, family matters. This is why Talison recently introduced a new parental leave guideline focused on enhancing accessibility, flexibility and gender equity.

Talison's guideline, informed by best-practice research and employee feedback, brings about substantial improvements in parental leave entitlements, reflecting Talison's commitment to supporting its employees at every stage of their journey.

Here's a glimpse of some of the significantly improved entitlements:

- reduced Eligibility Period: Employees are now eligible to take parental leave after just six (6) months of service with Talison;
- 26 Weeks of Paid Parental Leave for the Primary Caregiver: Permanent employees designated as the primary caregiver will be entitled to 26 weeks of paid parental leave, with the option to take it at half-pay;
- continued Superannuation Payments: Primary caregivers will continue to receive superannuation payments for up to 12 months, even while on both paid and unpaid leave; and
- Fertility Treatment Leave: Recognising the importance of fertility treatment, eligible employees are entitled to up to five (5) days of paid fertility treatment leave per calendar year. Furthermore, employees supporting their partners undergoing fertility treatment can access up to two (2) days of paid fertility treatment leave.

Talison is committed to supporting an inclusive workplace with family-friendly policies that benefit all employees and will continue to review and improve its practices where possible to do so.

Annual Noise, Dust and Water Report Presentations

A presentation was recently delivered to the local community group Grow Greenbushes and the Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes, focusing on Talison's performance in noise and dust management for the previous year. Key points included the absence of exceeding regulated limits in the most recent reporting period, alongside an overall increase in Site noise levels attributed to heightened mining activity (i.e. more, and bigger, mining fleet). Dust impacts, particularly noticeable during the dry summer months, were addressed, with information provided about additional monitoring conditions introduced in response to increased Mine throughput. The presentation also covered water management practices, highlighting the use of dams and pit voids for water storage, minimal groundwater usage and extensive monitoring to ensure downstream water quality remains unaffected. The very dry/hot and long 2023/24 summer period has been a very challenging period for Talison with respect to dust management in particular. Talison has significantly increased its real time dust monitoring network over the last 12 months with the aim of being able to better control and manage its dust impacts. A Dust Trigger Action Response Plan (TARP) is now in place which sets out a clear strategy for dust management.

ANZAC Day

I had the great honour of being able to honour the ANZAC tradition and lay a wreath on behalf of Talison at the ANZAC Day Dawn Service held in Greenbushes. The service was very well attended with the crowd being by far the largest I have experienced in my six (6) years living in Greenbushes. Well done to the team at the Greenbushes RSL who once again put on a fantastic service.

A couple of the RSL grandchildren carrying flags led the 100 or so veterans up Blackwood Road appearing out of the dark in front of the Cenotaph.

More than 300 people braved the early morning start participating in the service with the Jubilee singers leading the event with various songs and hymns. Sue Kemp led the praying of remembrance with Trevor Bottomley the RSL President giving the address for 2024. Tim Streeter played the last Post and the Reveille with the Choir singing

The Ode.

The service was concluded with the usual Gunfire

breakfast put on by the RSL members which was sponsored by Lotterywest.

The Yates family form Perth attended the event to march where their Great Grandad and Grandad enlisted in Greenbushes for WWI and WWII.

An added touch this year was the turnout of the Action Drill and Blast mining contractors portraying the ANZAC theme on the high Vis fluro work gear. In addition, one of the drill rigs has been wrapped in an ANZAC theme.

nbn Fixed Wireless network upgrades in Greenbushes and Balingup starting soon

Work has continued on upgrades to the **nbn** Fixed Wireless network in the south west, with work to upgrade the Greenbushes tower getting underway this month. The upgrade will benefit households and businesses across the south west, providing faster speeds and extending the coverage of the **nbn** Fixed Wireless network.

The \$750 million investment in the **nbn** Fixed Wireless and **nbn** Sky Muster satellite network - \$480 million from the Australian Government and \$270 million from **nbn** – is on track to be completed by December 2024.

When complete, the investment will expand the reach of the existing **nbn** Fixed Wireless footprint by up to 50%, as well as enabling two new high speed fixed wireless plans – Fixed Wireless Home Fast and Fixed Wireless Superfast. The additional capacity and reach available on the upgraded network will also enable approximately 120,000 existing Sky Muster satellite-only premises to access **nbn** Fixed Wireless for the first time.

Work has begun to enable the upgrades, including **nbn** introducing new technology and replacing some hardware on our fixed wireless towers.

The tower upgrades will mean some planned outages that may impact homes and businesses and their ability to use their **nbn** service while the work is underway. **nbn** will take all reasonable efforts to minimise service interruptions, however there are occasions where towers will be taken offline.

The upgrade work is scheduled to begin this month on the Greenbushes town tower, with work on the North Greenbushes and Balingup towers to occur in the weeks following. The tower works will not impact **nbn** Sky Muster satellite services. Impacted homes and businesses should be notified of any outages via their retail service provider.





Update from the Greenbushes Community Garden

Garden Go2 Community Garden prepares for winter

The Greenbushes Community Garden has just completed programming of events until the end of August. Winter events will be part of Fridgetown Fest.





On 18 May we will have Mrs Jenny Dewing from the Blackwood Environment Society talk about native trees and shrub species and getting these local species grow well on your property. Start 10am, \$5 for nonmember. Members free. Please bring a small plate of food to share.

During May the garden crew will continue to have their regular busy bees on Thursday mornings, between 9 and 1am.

Between June and August we will move to our winter starting time of 10am, but continue the busy bees on a

Thursday. We always finish events at the garden with a community building morning tea over savoury and cakes that the visitors and volunteers bring in to share.

The morning teas during the school holidays were especially well attended.



We enjoyed our April workshop where Justyna shared her methods for making wild fermented apple cider vinegar and wide-ranging general tips on fermenting processes. We combined local organic apples and water, gently encouraging the natural fermentation process. The result is a raw, unpasteurized vinegar that retains its probiotic goodness. Attendees went home with a lot of knowledge and plenty of produce to test.

During April the garden crew mainly prepared the garden beds for winter crop planting. Most garden beds have now been upgraded with clay and good soil minerals. The garlic has grown very well already

after being planted in March. Broccoli and cauliflower is doing well, the carrots are shooting and strawberry plants are winter ready.

There are a few apples still in the orchard to be harvested. Overall, the fruit trees gave us a good yield, but our vegetable harvest suffered from the hot summer days. Our April harvest included eggplants, beetroot, tomatoes, zucchini, rocket, heaps of pears, quinces, apples.





The garden gets a lot of visitors each year. On Anzac Day we had special visitors, Rebecca and Dave Yates from Perth, whose grandfather used to live at 22 Jephson Street, were in Greenbushes for the Anzac Day parade. They checked out the garden while completing our Treasure Hunt Game. We had a good chat and they had lots of fun at our beautiful garden.

Find Cancer Early: Tips when visiting your doctor about a possible symptom

As we get older, many of us don't often think too much about a change to our body. This can result in us expecting and accepting changes over time as being normal.

<u>But</u>, it is important to not be tempted to put something unusual down to 'getting older' before you've told your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker. Always have a chat and let them know what you've noticed, even if you're not concerned by it. Chances are it is nothing to worry about, but it's better to be on the safe side.

When you decide to make an appointment, lots of different questions and concerns can pass through your mind, such as:

- The doctor is always too busy.
- It's too hard to get an appointment.
- When I get to my appointment my mind goes blank.
- What could happen when I see the doctor or health worker?
- I don't have a doctor.
- I feel embarrassed or some shame.

Tips when you are visiting your doctor/health professional

- Be clear about your symptoms.
- Calling early in the morning is often the best time to arrange an appointment.
- If your usual health professional isn't available that day, ask for an appointment in a few days time, or ask to see another doctor.
- If you feel you need to speak to a health professional straight away, tell the receptionist it is urgent when you call.
- Write down why you've made the appointment and what you want to tell your health professional.
- Keep a symptom diary of what's been happening, how long for, and how often it occurs – you can take this with you.
- Health professionals are there to help you don't be embarrassed to let them know about any unusual changes you've noticed in your body.
- Take someone with you as a second pair of ears to listen & perhaps to take notes for you to clarify what is said during the appointment.

Become familiar with common cancer symptoms

We encourage adults, especially those over 40 years of age, to be aware of some common symptoms of cancers. You can give yourself the best chance to Find Cancer Early, by going to see a doctor straight away if you have symptoms, so that treatment is easier, and you can be around longer to do the things you love doing with the people you love.

In focus - diagnostic photography



Head front and lateral views of an exotic black imported fire ant (Solenopsis richteri) worker, focus stacked with a stereomicroscope and dedicated high-resolution digital camera.

Imaging technologies have evolved significantly over the past decade in terms of image resolution, quality, and magnification. It's easy to observe these changes just by looking at the continuous advancements in digital cameras and mobile phones. Less apparent to many is the progress made in macro and micro photography, significantly enhancing the ability to identify invertebrates, fungi, bacteria, and other subjects.

Modern software has evolved too. One such development is a process called 'focus stacking'. Multiple images, focused at different distances are combined, or 'stacked' to form a single, fully focused image. The images featured in this article were produced through focus stacking, making complex diagnostic features easily identifiable.

Our subject

The ant photographed is about 3 mm in length. This species is not present in Australia and is of biosecurity concern. To identify this species, diagnosticians (aka taxonomists) need to be able to see its microscopic features, which include a 2-segmented waist and 10-segmented antennae, with the last 2 segments forming a distinct club.

To get a bit more technical, a characteristic seen only among the 2 species of imported fire ant, is the median tooth centred along the front edge of the clypeus, which is flanked by 2 lateral teeth. The clypeus is one of the plates that form the "face" of an insect.

The digital advantage

Having digital reference material provides so many advantages. Photographing living specimens prior to curation allows for the full colour spectrum of a species to be captured and permanently recorded. Preserved specimens can lose their colours over time, for example, the eye colour of dragonflies and fruit flies fade shortly after they die.

Diagnostic imaging can facilitate fast-tracked identification as photos may be shared directly with specialists across the globe. This is particularly useful when local experts are not available or further verification is required. Utilising diagnostic photos also reduces the need to send specimens and helps safeguard them from damage and loss.

When communicating about the various pests or diseases that are present in WA or highlighting those to look out for, being able to show them in the environment, and the damage they cause is essential. Our department's imaging specialist helps to do this by creating high-quality digital products. Many of which are available on the Pest and Disease Image Library (padil.gov.au) and are featured on our website and communication products like posters, factsheets, and videos.

If you have taken a photo of something you don't recognise and it's not as flash as the ones featured in this article, don't worry! Please still report it. Photos and the information provided with them help us screen for pests and diseases of biosecurity concern.

A standing ovation was audience recognition of experiencing an extraordinary evening of music delivered by this most accomplished of choirs.



40km/hr zone



In response to community concern over the hazard posed by trucks through the Greenbushes townsite, the Shire submitted a requested to Main Roads WA (MRWA) for a 40 km/h speed zone to be implemented. Even though the roads are Shire controlled, MRWA are the regulatory body for all speed zoning on public roads in Western Australia.

Townsites are required to meet a number of specific characteristics to be considered for a 40km/h speed zone by MRWA. The Greenbushes townsite did not meet these requirements, however the Shire advocated strongly to MRWA about the unique circumstances of Greenbushes and the road safety issues needing to be addressed.

MRWA agreed with the case put forward by the Shire and recently implemented the 40 km/h zone. This is a great outcome and will improve road safety for the Greenbushes community.
