


The Tidy Towns judges at the Community Garden.



VOLUNTEERING ABROAD


Balingup One Family Volunteer, Sandra Dodson has been spending time in Cambodia as part of a project providing pushbikes, bike training, helmets and T shirts to 200 children.

The "On Your Bike" courses were held at three primary schools and the participants included children from very poor backgrounds.

Another project in Cambodia that One Family is contributing to is one that provides water filters so that families can have access to clean water. The biosand water filters are manufactured locally and combined with a Sawyer filter from the USA, so for US \$50 water can be provided to World Health Organisation standards.

One Family donations provided \$400 for the purchase of 10 filters in 2016 and a further \$750 was provided in 2017.

18 Months in reflection

It's been 18 months now since taking over as Coordinator at the CRC and in reflection we continue to grow our membership and customer base, offering new services, workshops and events for our community and the business community alike. We have noticed an increase in the number of people coming to our centre and I am personally happy with our continued growth. We have been successful in obtaining various grants to aid us in providing these services and I hope, through continued grant funding and community support, we are able to continue to grow our services.

Our CRC team of staff and volunteers are working together in helping to provide these services and we will continue to liaise with the community and respond to community needs with courses and workshops organised in response to feedback, requests and the needs of the community.

FREE - Showerhead Swap

The free showerheads, supplied by the Water Corporation are running out. If you haven't already, don't forget to bring your water bill and old showerhead along and swap it for a free water saving showerhead. Call the CRC for further details.





Shed initiative

The Community Shed project is gathering momentum as the Shed is taking shape and the necessary equipment is acquired. Located behind the CRC, the new Shed needs some lining, insulating and electrical work to complete the building. Equipping and upgrading a workshop is an ongoing task but we already have some good equipment on site.

We need to source and fund a large container to be placed near the Shed for the storage of materials and gear. The establishment of this community facility is expensive and could not be achieved without the assistance of grants. Applications to achieve the necessary funding

are being prepared. We are learning from the experience of the established Sheds in WA, and ideally we will encourage donations of funds and materials from community businesses and supporters. Like the other established Sheds, our Community Shed will undertake projects for people in our community who cannot repair or make the items they need, and our members will indulge in their own projects to make quality craft items that they cannot make at home. We also plan to help school children learn how to make things safely.


The CRC is offering televised information sessions for project initiatives and enhanced skills training and we are planning a group bus visit to established Sheds to consolidate our own vision. Skilled members will be on hand in the Shed to help if needed. But it's not "all work and no play".

The Shed will have separate open times for men and women (it's not just a 'men's shed') and it's not all about work. The Community Shed will be open to all who would like to make and repair items <u>and</u> to all men and women who would like to come and have a coffee and a yarn with like-minded people. Do you want to set the world right? Our Community Shed is for all of us; to take some time-out from routine to fulfil our dream projects and share some quality time with friends. In only a few months we have seriously launched this initiative. Interested? Curious? Come into the CRC and we'll show you our progress with the Shed.




CRC Coordinator's Column



Blackwood Basin Group Update



The Priority Bittern and Waterbird Biodiversity Enhancement Project, coordinated by the Blackwood Basin Group (BBG), has continued to make progress with lots of action at the Spring Gully Road site. The four year project, funded by the Australian Government, aims to create a wetland haven at Schwenke's Dam, Greenbushes, to attract critically endangered waterbirds.

Djeran - Ant Season

April is the start of Djeran, where traditionally we start to see a break in the hot weather. This year we seem to have started a little earlier than usual.

Keep an eye out for flying ants and red flowers which signal the change, and enjoy the cooler nights.

Landline Filming

Now that was an exciting few days. A crew from Landline came out to see what we've been up to which gave many of us our first taste of what it is like in front of the camera. Turns out it's a bit scary and we've all finished up with a newfound respect for actors and TV presenters.

Our entomologist, Paul, came down to help us out for the day and our volunteers were wonderful in keeping calm and looking professional. We had a great morning collecting insects with a couple of our younger scientists even making friends with the dragonflies.





Our segment will be up sometime this month so if you see us, cheer us on and be kind (we're a little nervous).

Thank you to our Greenbushes volunteers who were out and about helping with the project while the filming was on.

Thanks also to Brooke, Shakira and Ian who were on hand to meet the Tidy Towns Judge on March 21st to showcase their efforts and the project.

Fish Surveys

Dean and James from Indo-Pacific Environmental came down for a few days to map out the aquatic species in the New Zealand Gully waterholes.

It was fascinating to watch and see what they found. There are Long Necked Turtles, Western Minnows, Western Pygmy Perches, and Freshwater Cobbler, as well as the introduced species such as Redfin and Mosquito fish.

James and Dean very graciously gave us all (BBG staff, citizen scientists, and the Green Army) a great talk about their survey techniques and exactly how they do what they do.

Felicity Littleton's Plant of the Month

Stylidium repens: "Matted Trigger Plant"

Stylidium repens is one of many trigger plants that grow in this district, but not many flower at this time.

Stylidiums are called trigger plants because they have a very special Style (female part) that springs over like a trigger. This occurs after an insect has landed on one of the petals seeking nectar. The trigger mechanism dabs the insect with pollen, so that the insect can then transfer the pollen to another plant.

Once "sprung", the Style takes some time to re-set itself. Whether the Style arises from the bottom, top or side of the flower, can be a characteristic unique to each species, helping us to identify them. The Matted Trigger plant is a tiny creeping perennial herb. The word 'repens' means creeping.

The plant only grows to 10cms in height and is elevated above the soil on short stilt roots. It forms a tangled matted network to 20cms wide. The flowers are white with red marks.

Books I read tell me that they like sand —white, grey or yellow. I have spotted them in a variety of places. Other information might say that they flower from January to December, but here we are and in February and March they still feature happily around the bushland around Greenbushes.

WATERWISE SHIRE

The Shire has agreed to participate in the WA Water Corporation's Waterwise programme.

This is because towns in the Warren-Blackwood are susceptible to water shortages in our drying climate. We are 20-30 years ahead of earlier predictions of climate drying.

As a community, in general, we need to use water more efficiently. This requires leadership by influential local organisations. Shire Councils can take a leading role in demonstrating water use efficiency, and the Water Corporation can partner with Shires (at no expense to the Shire) to assist the promotion of water use efficiency.

Awards and recognition are available for Waterwise Shires that show particular leadership. At no cost to the Shire, Water Corporation can provide equipment to better monitor water use by different Shire installations in order to help identify leaks and where reductions in water use might be possible – saving water and expense.

Also at no cost to the Shire, Water Corporation can provide staff training in water use efficiency and the development of a Water Use Efficiency Action Plan.

The Water Corporation can also provide networking between Shires, Waterwise Recognition Events, and incentive schemes (such as the 'Showerhead Swap Program' in which the Shire is already involved).

The Water Corporation, working with the Department of Water and the Shire, can assist in the development of locally appropriate water use efficiency projects that can save the Shire, and/or the community, water and money. At this stage, any investment of Shire funds would be completely under Shire Council control.

RECYCLE RULES

MINE NEWS

Talison Lithium has announced an expansion project that will more than double production of lithium concentrate at

Greenbushes to approximately 1,340,000 tonnes annually.

The expansion comprises construction of a second standalone, purpose built, large scale chemical-grade lithium concentrate production facility which essentially mirrors the existing facility which will continue to operate and be expanded. A new second standalone crushing facility will also be constructed.

The engineering design work to define the scope and capital cost of the Expansion is now complete and site works at Greenbushes are expected to start in May 2017.

More than 90 percent of the project spend will be to local Western Australian suppliers and contractors.

During peak activities more than 200 contractors will be employed on site with 40 to 60 new permanent positions being made over the long term.

Commissioning of the expansion is anticipated to start in the second quarter of the calendar year of 2019.

This expansion ensures Talison is well positioned to meet the expected growth of the lithium market.

In other mine news in March Leonie Eastcott celebrated 30 year's continuous service to the Greenbushes Operations. Guy Meade celebrated 10 years of continuous service. We congratulate both Leonie and Guy on their commitment.


The impressive structure of bronze and stainless steel will resemble a large tree and with its unique design it will be a focal point for remembrance of an important aspect of the district's heritage.






