The Company is progressing the detailed design work for the proposed Mine Access Road. The working group, including representatives from Grow Greenbushes and staff from the Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes met during the latter part of March to undertake a 50% design review. Talison will now progress to a final detailed design which will be presented to the Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes.

Roadworks to extend the slow traffic passing lane from the Mine's Gate 1 to the Western end of Stanifer Street are progressing nicely, although will be good to see the works finished during the latter part of April.

MINE NEWS - Craig's Corner

Commissioning of the new Chemical Grade Processing Plant #2 (CGP2) is very near now with first ore planned to be fed through the new

crushing circuit in April. Recruitment of processing operators for CGP2 is complete with the new operators being integrated into the existing workgroups. It will be an extremely busy couple of months as we transition out of the construction phase into the commissioning phase.

Talison presented its response to the various concerns raised in the public submissions to the Environmental Protection Agency (**EPA**) in relation to the CGP3/4 expansion project on 21 March. Talison now awaits the decision of the EPA Board.

The mining team is eagerly awaiting handover of their new office facility in the next week or two. Mine activities continue to accelerate in preparation for CGP2 coming on line - the ROM pad for CGP2 is full of ore just waiting for the CGP2 crusher commissioning. Works to lift the embankment of Tailings Storage Facility 2 (**TSF2**) by the mining team are ongoing.

Processing activities have been dogged in recent weeks by a number of unplanned shutdowns which have adversely impacted on the stability of the plant and therefore negatively impacted recoveries. The maintenance teams are working hard to overcome these niggling issues and I look forward to a more sustained performance going forward.

Noongar culture and traditions were highlighted during a field walk near Schwenke's Dam in Greenbushes in March.

Bill Bennell and Nerilee Boshammer from Kooyar Wongi led the walk and provided participants with a Noongar perspective on local plant species, traditional practices, bush tucker and tools used by the Noongar people.

The event was funded by the West Australian Government's Natural Resource Management Programme (supported by Royalties for Regions) Community Stewardship Grants and was part of the Regional Herbarium Project coordinated by Cheryl Hammence and the local NRM team.



I as a councillor was able to participate in the Mine Access Road discussions which were held in late March to see how we can incorporate the suggestions and ideas presented to the Shire during the consultation period.

This was a very productive session and an updated design will now be completed which will incorporate those suggestions and details identified during the Talison stakeholder engagement meeting.

Some of these changes are significant and will reduce some of the potential impact of the early concept design. Once we as a group are happy with the final draft design it will be published to highlight the incorporated changes.

Tour of the Blackwood

It was good to see the Rotary tour of Blackwood pass through town again this year and by the feedback from the organisers there was a great turnout and raised some serious dollars (\$35,000) for BYA youth mental health program.

Support from the local businesses is once again fantastic so let us make this a premier fun and healthy activity on our calendar.

Support for Mental Health initiatives

The need to ensure support for mental health initiatives has been highlighted recently through a number of avenues. For some, this is all too often close to home. Once again, the annual Black Dog Ride has triggered conversations around depression and suicide prevention. It is important the stigma around mental health issues is removed, so people can more easily seek help and not remain isolated.

Congratulations to all those riders who took part in the Black Dog Ride and showed support for such a wonderful cause.

Two Years of a McGowan Government

As with any government, the McGowan Government has had some ups and downs. I am pleased some of our previous Royalties for Regions projects, such as the Regional Film fund, Southern Forest Food Council, and Manjimup revitalisation have continued to receive support. However, it is disappointing that regional grants have all but disappeared, there are limited opportunities for local governments to leverage state based grants, and small regional centres seem to be forgotten in favour of large metropolitan projects.

Under-employment, unemployment, and stagnant wages growth coupled with high rises in many State Government fees and charges, are having a devastating impact on West Australians. The State Government needs to look at what it can do to help families keep their heads above water.

Busselton-Margaret River Airport

It is very satisfying to see the Royalties for Regions investment in the Busselton-Margaret River Airport result in the opening of the new Freight Hub. This hub provides the opportunity to target new international export markets for South West wine, as well as agricultural and horticultural produce. It is exciting to think that fresh produce harvested in the South West could be on a restaurant table or supermarket shelf in Singapore the very next day. The next step is to convince the McGowan Government to invest in the new passenger terminal so we can attract an airline to schedule direct flights from the east coast. This would be a game-changer for the region and support the development of our tourism industry.

PLANT OF THE MONTH

with Felicity Littleton

Beaufortia squarrosa C.N. "Sand Bottlebrush"

For years I have heard this referred to as "Sandplain bottlebrush" but with either name, it clearly is a plant that is found growing on lovely sandy areas, along with many other sand-seeking plants. Be aware that this is not a Bottlebrush (the name given to Callistemons). Beaufortias belong to the Myrtaceae family, the same family as a large number of plants including the Eucalypts.

There are really only 3 Beaufortias growing in the South West.

Beaufortia decussata: known as "Gravel Bottlebrush". Decussate alludes to leaves arranged strictly in four rows, so that no foliage looks like a cross if viewed from the top of the stem. This species is found on gravel rises from Nannup to Denmark, flowering in Spring and Autumn.

Beaufortia sparsa: known as "Swamp Bottlebrush"...has a similar distribution to decussata, but flowers in Summer and Autumn. B. squarrosa also. All these plants have scarlet red flowers.

Picture 1 (below) shows what I thought was an orange form of Beaufortia squarrosa but I am told by a person who has a great deal of knowledge on the subject, that it is Beaufortia aestival. This species really grows North of Perth.

Either way, these plants, named I should have said, after Mary the Countess of Beaufort, look absolutely brilliant in the garden. Beaufortias are flowering now, when not much else is.

With all the discussion of lack of bee food and shortage of honey, these are perfectly designed for this very purpose.

Greenbushes Tidy Towns News



Greenbushes has once again registered for the Keep Australia Beautiful Tidy Towns Sustainable Communities competition for 2019.

This continues a long history of the town participating in the Statewide competition, having entered each year since 1996.

This effort culminated in Greenbushes being awarded the Overall State Winner in 2016. Along the way, Greenbushes has benefited from the involvement of the many community groups and businesses whose projects and events have been showcased by the Tidy Towns competition.

The town's 2019 submission is due by 14th June, with judging to follow in late June, early July. This year is the 50th anniversary of the Awards.

The competition covers various categories - Community Action and Wellbeing; General Appearance; Environmental Sustainability and Education and Litter Prevention and Waste Management.

89 bags of rubbish collected

On 24th and 25th March, a litter collection was carried out along the South Western Highway section from the Shire of Donnybrook-Balingup boundary to the Greenbushes Cemetery, including some side roads. It was generally felt that there was more litter than usual, with 89 bags collected. Currently, the litter is sorted and some of the items are able to be recycled, with thanks to our volunteers for sorting the litter.

Thank you to the volunteers who turned out for the pickup, your efforts are very much appreciated and seeing the clean roadside, even if only for a short time, is worth the effort.






