

# **NEW UNITS PLAN FOR STINTON GARDENS**



The Greenbushes Aged Community Committee (GACC) has been working very hard over the last five years to find a suitable way to enable more units to be built at Stinton Gardens Estate.

Stinton Gardens Estate on Blackwood Road in Greenbushes currently consists of 5 two bedroom units managed by a volunteer committee under the joint venture arrangement between the GACC, the Department of Housing and the Shire of Bridgetown Greenbushes.

These units provide aged accommodation for those seniors who are able to live independently, with or without aged services such as Silver Chain.

The original vision of GACC, was for up to 15 units to be built at the site. In 1992 the original two units were built and after much more hard work lobbying and fundraising by the committee, led by Barbara Della Patrona, Marlene DaRonch and Devonia Mildenhall, an additional 3 units were built in 2000.

The importance of seniors being able to remain within their community has long been recognised.

With demand for the existing units growing, the current GACC have been looking at ways the vision of more units could be accomplished in today's ever changing aged care sector and government funding arrangements.

We are now very happy to announce that a Memorandum of Understanding has been signed with Access Housing, a not for profit aged housing provider.

The Shire of Bridgetown Greenbushes has recently voted to support the change in vesting of the crown land upon which the units are built to Access Housing and work is progressing on concept design. GACC will continue to have input into the management of the units.

We will have 3, hopefully 4 units built at Stinton Gardens Estate commencing late 2018 with completion in 2019. Anyone interested in moving in to one of these new units should put their name down on our waiting list by filling out an application form at the Greenbushes CRC.

This is just an expression of interest so that the GACC can personally keep you in the loop closer to the time when the units will be ready for occupation. There is no commitment on your behalf at this stage.

# GREENBUSHES COMMUNITY GARDEN NEWS FOR JULY



We will be holding our annual *Plastic Free July* Morning Tea & Crop Swap on July 2 at 9.30-11.30am. This is our contribution as a community group to the fantastic environmental initiative that was co-founded by Rebecca Prince-Ruiz who is originally from Greenbushes.

What started as a local Perth event 6 years ago continues to grow exponentially with 10's of thousands of people from all around the world now participating.

Plastic Free July (PFJ) aims to raise awareness of the amount of plastic in our lives by encouraging people to eliminate <u>single-use</u> plastic during the month of July each year. Anyone who commits to this month inevitably continues with a permanent change in their plastic reliance.

When we look at our plastic usage there are some things that are easy to eliminate and removing them just takes a bit of remembering, organising and practice.

The top 4 single-use pieces are: plastic bags, straws, water bottles and takeaway coffee cups. Then there's a smaller amount of plastic that can be much harder to eliminate. If this is your first PFJ don't stress too much about the harder ones for now.

Start with the easy ones – like the top 4 mentioned and you'll feel a real sense of accomplishment. You can then chip away at the harder ones, finding your own solutions one by one at your own pace.



Just remember that every day, every single time you refuse plastic is significant. Collectively our efforts combine and they are already making a difference.

At our morning tea we will have a display for ideas and tools to reduce our plastic usage in July and beyond. There will be a few things for sale, but we don't want to send a message that to reduce plastic you have to buy more "stuff"!

This gathering is about sharing our ideas and encouraging each other. We want you to bring a list of your top 5 (or more!) ways that you already avoid plastic in your daily lives. We will then collate these and share them in our next newsletter update and on our Facebook page.

In the last 12 months there has been a real jump in awareness and local community action to reduce plastic in our everyday lives.

The inspiring Boomerang Bag movement is now in full swing in Bridgetown, the Greenbushes Fun Run's commitment to no plastic water bottles with the water refill station sends a great message to the wider audience and Grow Greenbushes eliminating single use plastic plates and utensils at our community functions are just a few significant examples.





# Pat's Patch

I would like to congratulate the Greenbushes Tidy Towns Committee for doing so well at the National awards In May, winning the Community Action and Wellbeing category and getting Highly Commended in 4 other categories.

This is no mean feat for a small community and essentially it represents what we as a community want our community to be....a great place to live.

Winter is upon us so please take care on the roads with the wetter weather and also more driving in the dark and poorer visibility. Please check your tyres to see if they are in good condition. There is not much between you and the bitumen!

Budget is progressing with a new Strategic Plan being compiled from the various community workshops held earlier this year. There will be an opportunity to comment on the plan in due course.

The Bridgetown in the Winter Festival has commenced and features a number of events over the next few months, in particular our own Greenbushes Winter Festival Weekend at the beginning of August 2017. If you are arty, have a look at the Greenbushes Art Trail and Exhibition which caters for all ages and art forms.

I have had a few questions regarding the size of our recycled rubbish bin compared to the red general waste bin, which is aimed to encourage everyone to recycle as much as possible. I do understand that this could put pressure on the larger families however residents can ask for a larger waste bin, but this does come with a cost which follows the user pays principle.

A tip for the month is to ask yourself (and your friends) how much time you spend rinsing out tins, yoghurt pots and other food containers before throwing them in the recycling. The truth is that you don't have to do this at all, because today's recycling systems can easily cope with the levels of food often found in or on these containers. We waste water, energy and time rinsing our recycling.

The biggest contaminant in our waste recycling is plastic bags....reuse them rather than disposing of them! And where possible don't use them-cotton bags are a great alternative.











# CRC Coordinator's Column

#### **Green Waste in Greenbushes**

At our last meeting we discussed the problem of the disposal of green waste in Greenbushes.

It is acknowledged that disposal of green waste for some residents is difficult. Over the years there has been an unofficial green waste dump down near the cricket oval which the Shire pushes up and burns periodically. See photos (right).

This area has become unsightly particularly recently with commercial dumping, material other than green waste being dumped and indiscriminate dumping where people have not tried to get their waste as far back into the dumping area as possible.

There has been a lot of discussion, both for and against, in our community about this green waste dump. Some of the discussion points have been:

- · Mulching of the green waste is not economical because of the lack of quantity of material and the undesirable high weed content of the green waste material.
- The costs of an annual green waste verge pick up would have to be passed on to residents.
- The cost and time requirements to the Shire of having to either chip onsite or take green waste back to Bridgetown each time would mean less gardening/maintenance work is done elsewhere in Greenbushes.
- Not having a green waste dumping area could lead to more random dumping in the bush.

· Having a Greenbushes green waste dump saves Greenbushes residents from having to travel to the Bridgetown waste site.

The Shire would like to understand how the residents of Greenbushes would like this issue to be dealt with. If you would like to have a say about this issue, please attend our June 1 meeting or contact one of the executive committee members above.

Peter and Greg from Draglines Dam-it and Bridgetown Bulldozing once again worked their magic on creating reed beds out of a steep sided gravel dam and clearing a bunch of large tree weeds from the top.

Unfortunately while a lot of the tree wattles look pretty they are just not native to Western Australia and end up creating a monoculture and forcing out our local plants. Our job is to hold them back long enough for our plants to have a chance.

While it looks a bit bare now, just wait until the reeds catch hold and start shooting up like they did at Schwenke's creating habitat areas for insects and birds, somewhere for them to live and feed.

# **Felicity Littleton's Plant of the Month** *Acacia urophylla*

Net-leafed Wattle is one common name for this very reliable Shrub.

Another publication names it as "Pointed leafed Acacia" which is not surprising as the name "urophylla" translates roughly from the Greek "ouro" meaning tail (referring to the tip at the top of the phyllode (leaf).

The phyllodes are prominently net veined, which for me, makes this an eye catching plant. It can grow up to 3 metres tall also.

The flowers are white to pale yellow, with a beautiful sweet smell, and it is one of the earlier flowering Wattles, flowering time being late Autumn to Spring.

#### Reduce, Reuse and Recycle

The Greenbushes C.R.C. has joined the Nespresso recycling system to help reduce the impact of waste and ensure aluminium coffee pods are recycled.

Aluminium capsules recycled with Nespresso are sent off to a specialist recycling plant where the aluminum is separated from the residual coffee. The coffee is then sent to a composting facility to be

transformed into compost, while the aluminium is recycled into new aluminium products.




