The 2018 Greenbushes Fun Run and MTB event broke the record for entries with 301 people registering across all categories this year.

The previous highest recorded number of registrations was 238 in 2014.

The 2018 event also raised the highest total for charity so far with a total of \$16,210.

Of this \$11,919 will be donated to the South West Autism Network and \$4,290 to Breast Cancer Network Australia (BCNA).


The fine weather made for perfect conditions at this year's event.

Students at Greenbushes Primary School are enjoying art with a specialist art teacher thanks to sponsorship from the Greenbushes Mine and contractors.

Talison Lithium, Global Advanced Metals, SG Mining and MSP Engineering have stepped in to provide funding for the school to employ Fiona Willis after the Education Department funding was no longer available.

Acting Principal Chris Mott invited representatives of the companies to visit the school on Thursday May 30 to see first hand the benefits of the project.

He said Mrs Willis was a great coup for the school and had achieved fantastic outcomes with the students in her time working at the school.

Mrs Willis has been teaching art in schools since 1981 with 20 years spent as teacher and artist in residence at Rosalie Primary School in Shenton Park. She first taught as a relief teacher at Greenbushes in 2017 after moving to the Bridgetown area in 2016.

Impressed with the work that she did with the students the school was keen to keep her services in 2018, however due to lack of funding this seemed unlikely until the partnership between Talison, GAM, SG Mining and MSP Engineering.

Mrs Willis said she hoped to increase children's self esteem through artistic expression.

She said success in the art room translated to success in the classroom.

NEW PRINCIPAL IN THE SEAT

Greenbushes Primary School's new Principal Chris Mott plans to build on the good work of staff and the community to improve the programs and practices at the school.

Mr Mott was appointed Acting Principal of the school in May and replaces Kay Kuzich who is on extended leave.

Prior to his move to Greenbushes Mr Mott was Deputy Principal at Bridgetown Primary School where he has been based for the past 13 years.

He brings to Greenbushes Primary School a wealth of experience - more than 22 years in teaching including working at remote schools in the Kimberley and out near the Western Australian border with South Australia and Northern Territory.

Mr Mott trained to be a teacher at Edith Cowan University and had his first posting to Kalamunda but within a few years he accepted a posting to a remote school.

The transition to country teaching was made easier because during his childhood Mr Mott lived in a number of regional towns when his father worked for the Police Department.

He says working in metropolitan and country schools has taught him to be resilient and flexible.

"I learned to take on a range of roles and value all the people who make up a school including staff, parents, kids and community," said Mr Mott.

Mr Mott, wife Kate and four children enjoy country life in the Bridgetown - Greenbushes Shire.

He is a strong advocate for public schooling.

"My children are at Bridgetown Primary School and Bridgetown High School and I am also a product of public schools," he said.

"It's been impressive in my first four weeks to see the quality of expertise and community support of the school. One example of this is Fiona Willis' work through the Art Programme, kindly funded this semester by Talison Lithium, SG Mining, MSP Engineering and Global Advanced Metals," he said.

"It's key things like this that make public schools fantastic places for students to grow."

Mr Mott's community involvement includes volunteering for St John Ambulance (now in his 12th year as a volunteer and trainer), membership of the Bridgetown Greenbushes Roadwise Committee and involvement in junior sports including umpiring local football and basketball.

In his spare time Mr Mott enjoys amateur bee-keeping and has a hive in his garden for home use.



HISTORIC MASONIC LODGE UPGRADE

One of the oldest buildings in Greenbushes, the Masonic Lodge, has had a facelift.

The Masonic Lodge was formed by founding members GM Williams and HG Keyser on September 19, 1907 and the land to construct a hall was purchased around that time for just £20.

The building was constructed in the early 1900s with some additions taking place up until 1924.

Members of the Masonic Lodge were happy to have the services of a pre-release work crew from Bunbury Prison over several weeks to help carry out the much needed work to the internal and external walls of the building.

It took the workforce of four people approximately 16 working days over 4 weeks to complete the job.

It is great to see the work of our many local volunteers acknowledged and appreciated.


People are often misled into thinking that CWA is only for the older ladies in the community, and in particular those who can craft, knit, sew, crochet and cook up a storm.

In coming newsletters I will provide more information on some of the laws and social issues that have been addressed by CWA.



Royalties for Regions is effectively dead

Trawling through the detail in the latest Budget it is clear that Royalties for Regions as we have known it, is effectively dead. The McGowan Labor Government has made decisions that, over the next four years, will in effect cut \$2.5b out of the \$4b legislated Royalties for Regions fund.

There is no money for camp schools, reduced funding for Community Resource Centres, and no CPI increase for the Country Aged Pension Fuel Card. Expenditure for Orange School buses and Patient Assisted Travel Scheme, that should come out of Consolidated Revenue as normal spending, is now coming out of Royalties for Regions. This is a sneaky way of taking money out of regional areas to spend on election promises in the metropolitan area.

Regional Tourism

The McGowan government's objective is to increase the value of visitor spend in WA from \$10 billion in 2016 to \$12 billion by 2020. However, the forecast increase in regional tourism spending is just \$50 million. This equates to a metropolitan target growth of nearly 37% and a regional growth target of just 1%. This grossly undersells WA's regional destination appeal, as visitors seek a range of unique experiences. It also massively undervalues regional WA's contribution to the overall State tourism sector.

Prescribed Burning

I am a strong advocate of prescribed burning as an effective way of managing the risk of out-of-control bushfires. When Minister for Regional Development, I allocated \$20 million to enhance the prescribed burning effort. This was very effective in reducing the fire risk and helped (the then) DPaW catch up with its burning program. Although the current McGowan Labor government budget has allocated resources toward fire mitigation activities, I am concerned there are no funds specifically assigned to prescribed burning.

Regional Film Fund—Breath

It was very exciting to see Denmark and surrounds showcased on the big screen in the movie adaptation of Tim Winton's novel 'Breath'. Congratulations to Ben Spence, originally from Margaret River, who admirably played the character Loonie. The potential for increased tourism is one of the reasons I strongly supported Royalties for Regions investment in the Regional Film Fund. This fund attracted film makers to explore and highlight regional landscapes and stories - such as Red Dog, Red Dog:True Blue, and Jasper Jones. It is very disappointing for regional communities that this initiative will no longer be supported.

Plant of the Month

with Felicity Littleton

Drosera bulbosa. (Small Sundew)

This tiny herb is one of the 27 sundews to be found in the South West.

They can be perennial or annual, with short or long stems, erect or climbing, but chiefly Insectivorous.


They supplement their nutrition by trapping and ingesting insects with the aid of sticky, hairy leaves that secrete enzymes to digest their captured prey.

This world wide family of plants are at their most diverse in the South West of W.A.

Drosera bulbosa is tiny, only growing to 30 mm, but stands out because of the stalked circle of flowers - sometimes up to 12 in a circle.

It was lovely to discover this little beautie flowering at this time of year.

Of course, some of the other species of Droseras (Sundews) are emerging now, particularly the climbing varieties. Some have a white flower others pink, but they are all great integral survivors of the Australian bushland.







Activities at the mine continue to be in line with our Budget.

The mining team has been busily getting the mine ready for the winter months.

Cape Crushing continued "bedding in" the new crushing circuit. Fair to say that they are experiencing some difficulties at the moment, but I am confident that in the longer term they will settle down and perform to our expectations.

The processing plants performed well during the month despite having to deal with an ever-changing source of feed into the plants as we processed stocks from the old GAM crusher stockpiles.

A major shutdown of the Chemical Grade Plant (CGP) was undertaken during the latter part of the month to facilitate various upgrades to the plant.

Construction of the CGP2 plant continues at pace with a major milestone for the project achieved during May with the erection of first steel on 9th May.

A new water storage dam was commissioned during the month and it is hoped that good rainfall in the coming months will assist to fill this dam. The accommodation camp for the construction crews was all but completed during the month.

On a negative note - it was disappointing to see that the mine perimeter fence located proximal to the mine lookout was damaged with a large hole being forced into the fence sometime during the weekend of the 6/7th May.

The perimeter fence is there for the protection of the public and to ensure that people (or animals) do not inadvertently (or intentionally) access the mine and be put in danger.

I would hate to see someone injured as a result of such a pointless act - if you would like to see the goings on at the mine then feel free to attend the Mine Open Day on Sunday July 8.







Ek Phnom School

Ek Phnom primary school is participating in the Schools for Excellence project and the School Director has shown a lot of enthusiasm for the project. He struggles to improve the scores of the school because the infrastructure is poor. The school currently teaches 349 students in Grades 1-6.

There are 4 good quality classrooms, used by 199 children

There are 4 poor quality classrooms but only 3 are used. 150 children are educated in these 3 classrooms.

The poor quality classrooms are used by Grades 1-2 (two classes are held in the morning and one class in the afternoon). The old classrooms were built in 1983 and are made out of wood with a tile roof and concrete floor. They have deteriorated as a result of flooding and general wear and tear. Three of the poor quality rooms are used but are not safe because the roof and walls swing up and down when the rain and wind comes. The school has a high risk of falling down at any time after an assessment of the foundation pillars.

As a result, the children have to move out during heavy rain and high wind. The water also damages the children's book, tables and clothes. The Cambodian teachers who work there, sum up what it is like to study in these classrooms when they say "children learn with scaring feeling from this building."

In 2016, an Australian NGO (Classroom of Hope) agreed to provide the US\$35,000 needed to build the school but since that time, construction costs have gone up. The total construction cost is now US\$38,886. The local community have fundraised \$1500 but this still leaves a shortfall of US\$2386 (A\$3200). Angie Winter, working in conjunction with Wendy Trow (One Family project), aim to bridge this gap by October 2018 so that the school can be built and is ready for students in the next school year.
