People interested in finding out more about the program should contact their local Shire or go to the Department of Fire and Emergency website for more information.



HIVE OF ACTIVITY AT COMMUNITY GARDEN

This year at the garden we will continue focusing on community engagement and education.

We have been having a great turnout to our monthly **morning teas.** They are held on the 1st Saturday of each month at 9.30, the next one will be March 7th. We always provide the cuppas and ask that you bring a small contribution towards the morning tea. We also encourage you to bring along any surplus fresh produce from your garden if you would like to swap or just to share around.

We often take our veggies over to the roadhouse where **Sharen** generously finds countertop space to display. We want to say a big thanks to Sharen for this and to everyone who has been buying the goods. These veggies have the smallest 'food miles' ever — literally just a 20 metre walk, no fossil fuels required!

Busy bees will continue at the garden on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month from 8.30 onwards. We always appreciate help on these mornings to continue the progress of this great community space.

Projects this year include the gabion wall and new garden bed which is well underway and the big ticket item for 2015 is the kid's natureplay area, which will slowly evolve over the year.

We will be having a stall at the **Balingup Small Farm Field Day** on April 18th, selling seedlings, plants, pickles, bee hotels and we will also be doing two talks at the black stump on Native Bees and how to build your own Bee Hotels.

Our workshop with **Peter Coppin** will be here before we know it, as this year seems to already be whizzing along. This is scheduled for the beginning of July, with the date to be confirmed closer to the time. Peter will be here for a few hours to show us everything we need to know about pruning stonefruit trees, nut trees, citrus, grapevines, he'll also be covering grafting techniques and orchard pest and disease management.

It's great to see our members and volunteers at the garden again for another year of fun. Our **AGM** is on the **11**th **March at 4.30.** All positions will become vacant and available for nomination / election. If you would like to become more involved with the garden, this is the perfect opportunity to come along.

COMMUNITY GRANT USED FOR GABION WALL

On March the 21st the Balingup History Group will be launching its new exhibition based on the sporting clubs in Balingup from 1898 – 1960.




The exhibition is open every day 10am to 4 pm in the back of the Old Packing Shed and entry is by donation.

There are also Youth Grants, Donnybrook Amphitheatre Events and Support for the Arts Grants available along with grants for building maintenance on Shire owned buildings.


The council is also able to consider financial requests for projects that fall outside the Community Grants Scheme. These requests must be submitted in writing to Council and will be considered as part of the budget process.



COMING UP APPLES - WITHOUT CODDLING MOTH

Western Australia is one of the very few apple producing regions of the world that is currently free of the devastating "coddling moth" and to keep it that way we all need to remain vigilant. Please monitor your fruit trees frequently and if you see something unusual report it by telephoning 1800084 881 or email info@agric.wa.gov.au.

The first sign of coddling moth is a hole in the fruit plugged with excreta of the lava inside. The lava or grub is white to light pink in colour with a dark brown head and it feeds on the insides of the fruit heading for the core.







Students will be able to get a close look at the large trucks which cart product from the Greenbushes Mining Operations to Bunbury each day. The programme seeks to educate about safety around large road trains.

NEW REGIONAL ARTIST DEVELOPMENT FELLOWSHIPS OPEN FOR APPLICATIONS

Regional artists and arts workers are invited to apply for up to \$30,000 to develop their professional skills and gain experience in the national and international arts landscape.

Federal Arts Minister Senator George Brandis announced funding for five Regional Artist Development Fellowships, part of the Australian Government's commitment to supporting professional regional artists and promoting a vibrant, creative life in Australia's regions.

Artists in our regions encounter additional barriers to city-based artists in accessing opportunities to develop their arts practice on a professional level.

These fellowships will provide artists and arts workers with new and valuable experiences that not only support their career but also deliver long-term benefits to the cultural life of their communities.

The five fellowships are:

The *International creative development fellowship* (\$30,000) which is open to regional artists to support a placement or experience outside Australia to develop creative practice.

The *Indigenous creative development fellowship* (\$20,000) which is open to Indigenous regional artists to support a placement or experience outside their region (including international, metropolitan or other regions) to develop creative practice.

The Young artist creative development fellowship (\$15,000) which is available for regional artists aged between 18 and 26 to support a placement or experience outside their region (including international, metropolitan or other regions) to develop creative practice or support their career path.

The *Institutional fellowship* and *Indigenous institutional fellowship* (\$30,000 each) will each support a placement for a regional artist or arts worker at an Australian arts institution. The placement could include formal training, mentoring with institutional leaders or a work placement.

Blackwood Basin Group Update



The Priority Bittern and Waterbird Biodiversity Enhancement Project, coordinated by the Blackwood Basin Group (BBG), has continued to make progress with lots of action at the site.

The four year project, funded by the Australian Government, aims to create a wetland haven at Schwenke's Dam, Greenbushes, to attract critically endangered waterbirds.

Dam modification

Dam modification is now complete along Spring Gully Road and the areas with sufficient water have been revegetated with mature clumps of rushes (Baumea articulata).

These clumps were dug out from the active mine site and included the plant's complex root system or rhizome which, past experience indicates, will help the plants to reproduce and further revegetate the site.

The site will also see thousands of native seedling being planted in the coming months with paperbarks, Jarrah, and Marri among many others.

Works will be starting at Charnley's shortly, which is an area to the north of the Greenbushes Pool near Dumpling Gully.

The plan here is to modify the water-bodies so that water can be held longer and areas will be ripped so that vegetation has a greater chance of establishing and reproducing.

Shallow wading areas and deeper pools will be created to provide a diverse range of habitats for native fauna.

1080 Baiting

1080 baiting for rabbits and foxes is planned for the month of March on the active mine site and at Schwenke's Dam.

Dog walkers and people with pets are advised to be extremely cautious in the area as pets that consume poisoned carcasses can die from secondary poisoning. Using a lead or avoiding the area is the best approach to keep your animals safe.

The Blackwood Basin Group along with the Bridgetown-Greenbushes Biosecurity Group organised a Red Card Fox Shoot recently. 11 foxes and 6 rabbits were shot by one landholder, which was a great effort. Unfortunately, we didn't get as many registrations as we had hoped but we plan to run another event next year.

Don't forget that the BBG has a number of fox and feral cat traps available free of charge (small deposit required) for those of you who can't or choose not to bait or shoot feral animals.

These traps are more successful in places where cheeky foxes are used to enclosed man-made structures such as sheds, chook pens, and under houses.

Floating Islands

The Waterbird Committee is made up of members representing a number of stakeholders; Talison Lithium, Department of Parks and Wildlife, WaterCorp, Ratepayers Association, and the local Shire.

After a recent productive meeting a several committee members helped to plant and install 4 artificial islands supplied by committee member Bernie Masters.



These islands are made from recycled materials and have been planted with native wetland seedlings whose roots can work their way down into the water column.

The islands were then covered in bird netting to prevent the seedlings from being pulled out.

The whole process was filmed and a short video will be ready to watch on Facebook and the BBG website soon.

In 6 months to a year the plants will have grown through the bird netting and into a floating mass of habitat for waterbirds with its own protected nursery pool area in the middle ready for chicks to explore.

Greenbushes Wetland Invertebrate Project

Our welcoming, hardcore band of volunteers continue to meet every Tuesday at the Community Garden Centre to collect, identify, store, and catalogue the bugs and other invertebrate fauna that are found at the site. Well over 300 specimens have been collected to date and we are building up quite a picture of the various water-bodies that make up the project site.

At present there is an abundance of Blue Skimmer Dragonflies on and around the water who often perch on a spot just above the water before flying off and returning to the same spot. Females can be seen dipping their tails into the water while flying to deposit eggs.

New members are welcome to come along and help out in any way they can. It's a great way to learn about the natural environment and the connections between land, water, plants, and animals.

Notice of intention to Lay 1080 poison at Schwenke's Dam and the active mine site including the Southampton and Austins Dam areas, Greenbushes

The Blackwood Basin Group and Talison Lithium (or licensed contractor) intend to lay 1080 poison baits at Schwenke's Dam and the active mine site including the Southampton and Austin's Dam areas for the control of foxes and rabbits. We intend to commence baiting in <u>March, 2015</u> and complete the baiting program in <u>April, 2015</u>.

Please be advised that 1080 is highly toxic. The consumption of an animal that has ingested a lethal or sublethal dose of 1080 poses a serious risk of secondary poisoning to humans and other species. Taking of carcasses, removal of hides, and shooting or trapping animals (for human or animal consumption) is prohibited during the baiting period and for at least 14 days after the completion of the baiting program.

Please ensure children and other persons in your care are restricted from entering the site of baiting. Please restrain your pets, working dogs, and stock to avoid the possibility of poisoning through direct baiting or through eating 1080 poisoned animals.

Small Landholder News

Now is the time to start preparing for the cooler weather of Autumn and Winter.

Weed control at this time of year is all about planning. Before the break of season it is important to give some thought to winter weed control. From last year's paddock records you should have a good idea of what weeds were present in the pasture and it is also useful to consider what the paddock will be used for and the weed burden that may be present.

Ensure any fallen or unmarketable fruit is removed or destroyed to reduce pest and disease and maintain baiting programs for Mediterranean fruit fly.

If you own livestock it is important to practice good hygiene when working with your animals. Infectiious diseases that are able to be transmitted between animals and humans are known as zoonosis. To reduce the risk of catching diseases like scabby mouth, Q Fever and leptospirosis from cattle and sheep, wear gloves whee possible and do not handle animals with lesions without wearing gloves.
