"Music is in everyone and it's just a matter of providing the right environment and opportunities for students and I am pleased to be able to work with the students in our community," said Mr Kirk.

Mr Kirk said music could also assist students' social and academic development.

"There is a link between music and learning and it also gives students some social skills that they can use, such as picking up a guitar for a shared sing-a-long with friends," he said.

Mr Kirk said the short term goal for the choir was to teach students the rudiments of pitch and that the voice was an "instrument."

"I want to help get students ready to perform for school events first but the longer term goal is to have them perform for community events and ultimately the Bunbury Eisteddfod," he said.

The focus for the instrumental programme will be the ukulele.



The new ablution block, which is suitable for people with disabilities is located at the entry gates to the Cemetery and provides a unisex toilet and basin.


The Cemetery signs have also been updated with the main change being additional names since the sign was last manufactured.

#### REGIONAL POOLS GET A BOOST

Local public swimming pools and acquatic centres in the Warren-Blackwood are will be given a funding boost via Royalties for Regions.

Warren Blackwood MLA Terry Redman said almost \$3m in funding would be provided for the Community Pool Revitalisation Program with money going towards 94 aquatic centres including Bridgetown, Boyup Brook and Donnybrook.

Mr Redman said each town would receive \$32,000 to ensure community pools continued to be safe and vibrant places to enjoy physical activity.

# Blackwood Basin Group Update



The Priority Bittern and Waterbird Biodiversity Enhancement Project, coordinated by the Blackwood Basin Group (BBG), is a four year project, funded by the Australian Government, which aims to create a wetland haven at Schwenke's Dam, Greenbushes, to attract critically endangered waterbirds. There are exciting times ahead in 2016 with two workshops completed and more in the works and we are gathering more information and spreading the expertise to our local citizen scientists.

## 2016 WA Wetlands Management Conference

On World Wetlands Day on 2<sup>nd</sup> February, the Wetlands Management Conference was held at the Cockburn Wetlands Education Centre.

Margaret Jakobson and Sara Weir from The Blackwood Basin Group, along with our friendly entomologist Paul Van Heurck, joined in the fun by running a workshop on the identification and collection of aquatic macroinvertebrates.

The conference itself was certainly inspiring. From the welcome by Rev. Sealin Garlett, through the presentations by very respected professionals in the field of wetland management, and finally to the panel discussion on wetland policy when the Shadow Minister for the Environment and Climate Change, Mr Chris Tallentire MLA and the member for South Metropolitan, Hon Lynn MacLaren MLC stood up to answer questions from the participants about wetland policies.

We've all come away with renewed zeal and hope for the future of our catchment and wetlands.

## **Cockatoo Workshop**

The cockatoo workshop was a complete success. The morning started off with the hint of rain making everyone a little nervous about the bush walk, but the rain soon cleared leaving us with the perfect weather to search for cockatoo signs.

Tegan Douglas, the Forest Black Cockatoo Project Coordinator from Birdlife Australia, showed us all how to be bird detectives out in the field and use the signs of scat, feeding, and roosting to determine which cockatoo has been in the area.

After morning tea back in Greenbushes, Tegan took us through the more specific ways of telling the differences between Baudin's, Carnaby's, and the Forest Red-Tailed Black Cockatoos based on appearance and calls.

We are all set now to take part in the Great Cocky Count in April, the biggest single survey for black-cockatoos in Western Australia. To be involved see the details below.

#### **CHANGES AFOOT FOR TAFE SYSTEM**

The State Government is to reduce the number of West Australian TAFE colleges from 11 to five from April 2016.

There will be two colleges in the Perth metropolitan area and three colleges across the regions and the TAFE brand will be reinstated in recognition of its awareness in the community.

Training and Workforce Development Minister Liza Harvey said reducing the number of colleges across the State would achieve a stronger emphasis on engagement with local communities and industries.

Ms Harvey said the changes would not impact on existing training contracts as they would be administratively assigned to one of the five remaining TAFE colleges under the new structure.





## FIRE MANAGEMENT IN GREENBUSHES

In regard to fire management in Greenbushes, the Shire has completed a number of fuel reduction burns within the townsite over the last few years.

There are no Shire reserves that have not been addressed. Local landowners have either complied with fire reduction orders, or the Shire has completed the works and charged the individuals for these works. Landgate has also been extremely supportive and has ensured unallocated Crown Land under their responsibility has been slashed to meet the Shire's requirements.

In relation to the land outside of the Greenbushes townsite, which is primarily managed by Department of Parks and Wildlife (DPaW), the community, through the Ratepayers and Residents Association have been working with the Shire and DPaW to reduce the fuel loading around town.

This has been a very successful approach, with all but one of the areas burned over the recent years. The fuel reduction mosaic burn off plan was developed with the community and mostly complied within the agreed timelines. Unfavourable weather conditions during the planned burn off periods, have resulted in some delays in the planned burns.

The final area that has not yet been burned is the New Zealand Gully area, which is planned either for this autumn, or for spring, subject to approvals and favourable weather conditions.



The successful approach that has been developed to carry out these burns has been used as a template to develop similar plans for other towns and communities.

One of the outstanding items raised from the previous fires is to complete the firebreaks along the rear of the Telluride Street houses and State Forest areas.

DPaW has committed to carry this out when they next have mobile equipment in the area. This may occur when the fuel reduction burns are carried out at New Zealand Gully.

It is pleasing to see the wonderful turnout on the first day of the opening of the newly refurbished Bridgetown Swimming Pool on the weekend of February 27 and 28.


Just under 800 people attended the pool thanks with the Shire granting FREE admission for the weekend. It is


