Blackwood Basin Group Update



The Priority Bittern and Waterbird Biodiversity Enhancement Project, coordinated by the Blackwood Basin Group (BBG), has continued to make progress with lots of action at the Spring Gully Road site. The four year project, funded by the Australian Government, aims to create a wetland haven at Schwenke's Dam, Greenbushes, to attract critically endangered waterbirds.

Green Army

Once again we've been so lucky this year to get the help of the wonderful Green Army crew led by Jonny Perfumo. This time they built a new track which will be the connecting path between the end of the new boardwalk at Schwenke's and the existing circle track.

They also cleared off the existing track between Schwenke's and Greenbushes Pool, searched and destroyed some invasive weeds along that area, and managed to eradicate a full ute load of weeds around Mikey's.

Even with all that they still managed to get a great meeting with the new ranger, Ros, and learn all about the specific details that go into the ranger side of landcare, they had fun with insects and learning about bio -indicators of wetlands, and learnt all about various plants with Felicity $\it Ros$ $\it the$ $\it ranger$ $\it talking$ $\it to$ $\it the$ $\it Green$ $\it Army$ $\it team$ Littleton who donated her time to teach them about seed collection and plant identification.

Snakes in Cooler Weather

With all the unusual cooler weather we've been having lately, it is a good time to remember that snakes can actually be more dangerous on the cooler summer days. They still need the heat of the sun to warm up enough to move so they end up sluggish and slow. Unfortunately, this means that they just don't move away quickly (or much at all) when someone walks very close to them and snake bites can be more common.

Be careful when walking through the bush. Only walk where you can see your footing, and always wear bush appropriate footwear and clothing.

Felicity Littleton's Plant of the Month

Ptilotus manglesii: "Rose tipped Mulla-Mulla"

Only two species of Ptilotus are to be found in the South West. These Ptilotus or Mulla-Mullas belong to the AMARANTHACEAE family. Amaranthus means "unfading flower", so, in a way they can remind us of everlastings, but are totally different in plant structure.

Many members of this family are showy and colourful, however, these Mulla-Mulla's have bright pink petals among long woolly hairs. The long haired feathery sepals most likely protect the flower from harsh weather, as most species of Ptilotus are to be found in the arid interior of Australia.

Ptilotus manglesii is a small perennial herb, prostrate in form with upturned stems growing to 60cms.


With our process plants now operating on a continuous basis, 8 of Talison's casual employees have transferred to permanent employment.


