

James and his fellow walkers joined me at Parliament House for lunch and to meet Health Minister Roger Cook. James asked some very pertinent questions and is an inspiration to us all.

Camp Schools

The CWA conducted their first ever rally - marching to Parliament House to show their support for rural education including the retention of camp schools. Their message was very clear - rural students matter and education is the foundation of our communities.

There will be a stand at the Warren-Districts Agricultural Show on Saturday 17 March where people can show their support by signing a petition to save our camp schools. I hope to see you there.

Trip to Canberra - Southern Forest Irrigation Scheme

In February I travelled to Canberra with Mia Davies and Colin Holt to show our strong support for the Southern Forest Irrigations Scheme and to promote the bid for Federal funding.

We met with three Federal Ministers to promote Western Australian projects and to keep regional WA in the forefront of funding decisions.

I have been working with a number of farmers in the region regarding unfair water access limits and will continue to represent their case. We need to ensure sufficient water is available to maintain a sustainable and productive horticultural industry.

Report into Royalties for Regions

The recently released Langoulant report's attack on Royalties for Regions is another reason we need to keep fighting for regional projects. I am incredibly proud of the difference Royalties for Regions has made to regional WA and the wide range of both large and small projects undertaken. These range from aged care to telecommunications to affordable housing. I have seen many community groups benefit including upgrades to ambulance facilities, environmental work, childcare facilities and events that attract tourists. I stand by all these projects as being well planned, worthwhile and beneficial to the region.






BALINGUP FIELD DAY

I had the pleasure and opportunity to watch the Commonwealth Games Relay pass through Bridgetown on Friday last week and I must admit it does make me proud to be an Australian. Besides all the security and support crew that goes with this event, the attitude and positive vibe that all these people reflect is fantastic. Thanks to the Shire, as they did a great job with the entertainment and function after the baton carried on to Bunbury for the next leg of its journey. Also, a big thanks to all the Shire staff who were involved in one way or the other in assisting with the event to make it go smoothly and enjoyably. It was also a pleasure to see our Greenbushes representative Leonie Eastcott participate in the baton relay.

A reminder that the unofficial Green Waste site is closed and green waste will now either need to be taken to the tip, or if it is smallish quantities, it can be taken on the flatbed truck provided by the Shire on the last Saturday of each month from behind the shops. To respond to a few negative comments about the Shire taking away another service to Greenbushes, this was not an official service and for well over 10 years there has been no tip service in Greenbushes and for a small town and the considerable environmental licence requirements, a tip will never be justified.

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services is still looking at doing an autumn burn in the New Zealand Gully bush block and/or the bush block to the north of that, between the South Western Highway and the railway line, DaRonchs Road and Grimwade Road, so please be on the lookout for this notification and make sure you are prepared and fire ready.

The new shade sail at Thomson Park should be erected by the time this newsletter is out. Apologies for the delay, however, the process was very complicated, requiring grants from two different organisations and the preferred contractor eventually pulled out due to engineering design compliance issues, so the whole process had to be started again.

The dog exercise area signs are now installed at the Greenbushes ovals and in addition, doggy doo bags have been installed to encourage locals and visitors alike to clean up after their dogs.

The Greenbushes Community Shed hopes to offer more workshops like this in the future. So watch this space!





One is very common: Pteridium esculentum (Bracken Fern) which is pretty much everywhere in the forest understory. This large fern held many uses for early Aboriginal people.

However the little fern I am writing about today is tinier and more elusive.

Ferns have FRONDS rather than leaves. As is obvious, ferns do not flower. They are an earlier form of plant life than flowering plants.

Lindsaea has fertile fronds and non-fertile fronds.

The fertile fronds hold the tiny spore cases enabling the fern to reproduce via spores.

The fertile fronds are erect, and 40mm long; while the sterile fronds are shorter and spreading.

Stalks of the plant are dark brown to Black. Lobes on the fronds are Fan shaped, flat when sterile and bent downwards when fertile.

The spore cases are borne along the outer margins of the lobe.

This fern also grows in all Australian states as well as New Zealand and New Caledonia.
