Myself and Jacqui managed to have a brief escape to Prevelly Beach over the Easter/ TALISON ANZAC holiday period. Apart from some pretty rough weather over the Easter weekend the

sun was shining and afforded us some good walks along the beach and lazing in the deck chairs. Sad to say that my efforts at fishing were sub-optimal with plenty of seaweed and snags the only thing caught.

We had the opportunity during April to present the Talison/Greenbushes story to:

Talison's marquee at the Balingup Small Farm Field Day was well attended with the sandpit again proving popular with the younger brigade. This was my first time attending the event and the weather on the day was absolutely magnificent, and certainly an improvement on last year. I certainly hope that people took the time to enjoy the hospitality of the Talison team. I would like to thank all the Talison staff who volunteered their time on the day to answer community queries.

I again had the great pleasure of attending the Greenbushes ANZAC Day Dawn Service and was privileged to be able to lay a wreath on behalf of all Talison employees and contractors. It was fantastic to see such a great turnout on what was a cool but clear morning. The service was again a credit to the Greenbushes RSL and all who participated.

Was great to see the participation of Talison staff (Leo Su and Bianca Spice) in the University of Newcastle and Bunbury Leschenault Rotary Club's Science in Engineering Challenge held in Bunbury. Teams of students from South West schools participated in the annual event which sees students meet various science challenges.

Congratulations to Martin Quill who recently celebrated his 25-year anniversary of working at Greenbushes the fourth employee to reach a major milestone this year.

Greenbushes recorded an important milestone on Wednesday 10 April with the first truck of spodumene concentrate leaving site bound for the Tiangi Lithium Refinery in Kwinana.

Work on the final detailed design work for the proposed Mine Access Road continues. The final detailed design will be presented to the Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes later this year.

Roadworks to extend the slow traffic passing lane from the Mine's Gate 1 to the Western end of Stanifer Street are progressing nicely, although it will be good to see the works finished in the coming weeks.

Commissioning of the new Chemical Grade Processing Plant #2 (CGP2) is very near now with first ore planned to be fed through the new crushing circuit in mid-May. Recruitment of processing operators for CGP2 is complete with the new operators being integrated into the existing workgroups. It will be an extremely busy couple of months as we transition out of the construction phase into the commissioning phase.

The mining team has finally moved into its new office facility located atop the IP Dump next to SG Mining. Mine activities continue to accelerate in preparation for CGP2 coming on line - the ROM pad for CGP2 is full of ore just waiting for the CGP2 crusher commissioning. Works to lift the embankment of Tailings Storage Facility 2 (TSF2) by the mining team are ongoing.

Processing activities have improved in recent weeks as plant runtime has stabilised and we remain on track to meet our full year Budget production requirements.

Every time I tell someone from outside Greenbushes that we live in Telluride Street, they say:

- "Pardon?" or
- "Sorry, would you say that again, slowly?" or
- "How do you spell that?" or
- "Tell-yer-ride? What does that mean?"

That got me thinking: What did our town planners have in mind when they laid out and named the street plans for Greenbushes and North Greenbushes?

Discovery Centre records show that a 5000 acre timber concession was established at North Greenbushes in 1890 and that the Post and Telegraph Office was established in 1891, with the first school building opened in 1893.

Accordingly, there must have been some sort of formal structure to the town in 1893 for there to have been an established postal service, at least one store, and a register of occupants.

In our early days of settlement, roads in the country were usually not named formally for years but were known locally by what was on the road, or by the surname of the early farmers who lived out along that track.

My favourite is "Slaughterhouse Rd" on the east of the Highway where the local butcher did his "product preparation". When that ceased, the road became "DaRonchs Rd" where the Da Ronch family lived.

Another road with recognised links to the locals is "Eastcott Rd" where the Eastcott family farm still sits today. But the streetscape and naming for a town site was more formal than that, as in the town of Greenbushes.

Five of the Greenbushes streets have technical names and the remainder are either geographic or personal. I needed the answers to all of the questions: what, who, how, and why?? So I Internet searched "Greenbushes WA street names". That only confirmed the list I had already made from our local maps; not a good start. "When the Internet fails, ask a local" is a well-entrenched principle in Greenbushes. So I did.

Greenbushes is a carefully-planned town with a former highway, now Blackwood Road, as the centre-piece main street. The original South West Highway was realigned to the East in 1976 when the miners convinced the Government that the tantalum ore lode ran directly across and beneath the Highway. The argument was compelling; the mine future was far more important than a bit of short-term driver inconvenience. They'd soon get used to it.

The rest of the town was already a matrix of address streets for home frontages, with rear "right-of-way" access tracks between each of the streets, and pedestrian walkways running at right angles from the high streets down to the main road.

Originally, before the days of individual septic tanks and scheme waste systems, the rear "right-of-way" access tracks across the back of the blocks were for the night-cart drivers to empty the private, outdoor dunnies of sewerage waste. Now, they serve as ultra-convenient, rear-fence-line entry points to all properties; a real asset for numerous properties with back-yard garages and sheds. And they also serve as access for trade vehicles, caravans, trailers, boats etc. that often can't enter the owners' property from the address street at the front.

The layout of Greenbushes and North Greenbushes is too formal to be random. So there must have been some logic to the names, but unfortunately, the Shire no longer has records of how, what or why; obtaining and keeping legible paper records from 120 years ago in the horse-and cart and handwriting days is no mean feat. I did get valuable clues however. Initially, it is obvious that the streets in **Greenbushes** are named after three primary themes: the *mining industry*, *notable people*, and *local landscape*. Although no record has been found of the formal *process* of town-planning that outlined the street names and their rationale, a number of conclusions are reasonable.

# **Mining:**

# Stanifer St.

From our school chemistry, we know that the Periodic Table of elements lists tin as "Sn" being an abbreviation of the Latin "Stannum" meaning tin. Scientific articles use the term "staniferous" to describe tin-bearing deposits. Prior to the realignment of the Highway, Stanifer St. stopped at George St. but given the significance of the discovery of tin in 1888 to our Greenbushes existence, it is highly appropriate that Stanifer St. is now a primary entry to Greenbushes.

## **Diorite St.**

Diorite, Galena, Telluride and Tourmaline are all geological mineral names. "Diorite is the name used for a group of coarse-grained igneous rocks with a composition between that of granite and basalt" (Hobart M. King Ph.D., RPG). That's a serious rock.

# Galena St.

"Galena, also called lead glance, is the natural mineral form of lead sulphide. It is the most important ore of lead and an important source of silver." (Wikipedia)

# **Telluride St.**

Telluride is "a chemical compound of tellurium and another element including gold and silver. Telluride is found in mineral ores." (The American Heritage Science Dictionary)

# **Tourmaline St.**

"Tourmaline is a crystalline boron silicate mineral compounded with elements such as aluminium, iron, magnesium, sodium, lithium or potassium. Tourmaline is classified as a semi-precious stone and the gemstone comes in a wide variety of colours." (Wikipedia)

Having grown from the original, low-density population of the forestry and agriculture economy of the Blackwood Valley, to the Greenbushes town matrix with its high-demand mining initiatives, it is not surprising that these sources of valuable minerals were chosen for some street names in the town.



**Local landscape: Blackwood Rd.** This main street in Greenbushes is named from the Blackwood Valley and the Blackwood River. The River is the longest continuously-flowing river in WA, resulting in the Blackwood Valley, a prime feature of the South West landscape which contains some of WA's most scenic and attractive, character-filled towns.

The Blackwood Valley was first settled in the late 1800's by timber workers and farmers. It is still a thriving region for the descendants of those industries as well as tourism and today's high-tech mining.

It is likely that the name Blackwood was in honour of Vice-Admiral Blackwood who fought in the British fleet and was highly praised by Admiral Lord Nelson. Blackwood was a person of renown for the early settlers of Australia. *However*, Shire records note that Blackwood Rd was earlier known as Walter St. That's fascinating: more on that when we get to Walter St in North Greenbushes.



### Manjimup - Missing mail

The saga of the missing mail in Manjimup continues. My office is working closely with the Postal Industry Ombudsman and Australia Post National Resolutions team to determine the reason mail is going missing. Initially there was speculation mail was being stolen after delivery, however many items are not being delivered to locked boxes - so this theory does not fit all circumstances. It appears the issue is much more complex than originally thought - so the investigation continues.

In regard to vehicle licencing, you can check when your vehicle registration expires by simply entering the plate number at <a href="https://online.transport.wa.gov.au/webExternal/registration/">https://online.transport.wa.gov.au/webExternal/registration/</a> I am sure the CRC can assist if you need help with this.

### **Regional Hospitals**

In meeting constituents around the region, fears about the long term plans for our smaller regional hospitals have been raised. I hear stories about the tired condition of some of our older hospitals and suggestions they are understaffed. I have written to the Minister for Health to seek assurance that the McGowan Government will support these vital health

services and adequately fund hospitals in the region.

### Support for people with disabilities

The transition to the National Disability Insurance Scheme is proving difficult for some families and a number of issues are emerging, especially in regional areas. Parents tell me the option to self-manage the funds is actually not an option for many people, as the paperwork is overwhelming and the level of reporting too onerous. Key areas I am seeking support is local access to an independent support person to help families broker personalised, tailored solutions within the parameters of the NDIS funding package; and access to funding for respite.

### Consultation re Voluntary Assisted Dying

Consultation regarding the draft Voluntary Assisted Dying legislation is currently underway with the discussion paper available at <a href="https://ww2.health.wa.gov.au/voluntaryassisteddying">https://ww2.health.wa.gov.au/voluntaryassisteddying</a>

# PLANT OF THE MONTH

with Felicity Littleton

Melaleuica lateritia:

Common name: "Robin red-breast bush".

Robin red-breast bush is one of 22 Melaleucas to be found in the South West.

The bush itself does not conform to perceived ideas about Melaleucas. The plant growing to only 2 metres, has coarse fibrous bark but not the typical 'paper bark' stem. Melaleuca means black and white, which refers to the white papery trunks seen after a fire and the lateritia specie name means something which is made of bricks or brick red in colour.

So far, from what I have observed, M. lateritia does not occur naturally in this district. I would love someone to prove me wrong. The picture is taken from some very successful rehabilitation planting carried out at Spring Gully Dam (a small waterbody nearby Schwenkes Dam). Other plantings of this bush are seen at Dumpling Gully. It is a perfect riparian plant. I have seen the plant growing naturally on the roadside from Donnybrook to Capel. Of course, it is seen in ditches, swampy areas and beside other water courses.

Although it grows in wet situations, it can be highly adaptable, also surviving in a reasonably dry environment. I love this plant for the fact that it is an archetypal Australian plant. This means that it is perfectly designed for our conditions, and yet it also makes an excellent garden plant. It needs no fussing over and will supply the needs of pollinators.

I had two of these plants in a very small garden in the past. Recently, we identified another Melaleuca growing at the East end of Mt Jones (Melaleuca lateriflora). This is a much taller plant (tree), growing up to 8 metres. Books I read say that is pretty rare in Perth, also that it is quite broad rather than tall. In fact, its common name 'Gorada" is an aboriginal name meaning 'little' or 'short'. The trees out at Mt. Jones, I think are taller sub-species.


Come and see me if you are interested in seeing the Robin red-breast bushes around here, I will even show you how to grow them if you like.





The Warren Blackwood Vintage Car Club members and farmers from the Mayanup area visited Greenbushes in April to view the Talison Lithium Mine.


