## World Champion and Olympic Medal Cyclist to Visit Greenbushes



World Champion cyclist and Olympic medallist Marianne Vos will make an exclusive visit to Greenbushes Primary School on Thursday November 10th to speak with students about her career and the sport of cycling.

Members of the community are welcome to attend the event which will take place at 10am in the School undercover area.

The visit has been organised as part of the Tour of Margaret River Road Cycle Race which will see some 600 riders, including Ms Vos, cycle through Greenbushes on the Nannup Stage of the event on Saturday November 12th.

A vantage point has been set up at Kandalee Farm Hill on Maranup Ford Road on Saturday November 12th between 9:45am and 11:00am for spectators to watch the riders climb the hill on their way into Greenbushes. 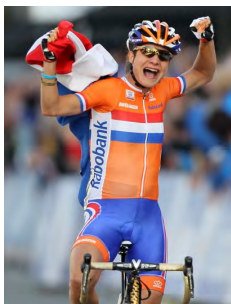

## Tour of Margaret River Cycle Race Stage through Greenbushes



Greenbushes residents will have a world class vantage point to watch 600 cyclists participating in the Tour of Margaret River "Nannup to Nannup Stage" on Saturday November 12th.

Among the group will be world champion cyclist Marianne Vos and Tour de France legend Robbie McEwen.

Members of the community are welcome to attend the Kandalee Farm hill vantage on Maranup Ford Road, but must be at the location before 10am at the latest to avoid being caught up in traffic or cyclists as they make their way from Nannup to Greenbushes along Maranup Ford Road.

Free Parking will be available in the paddock adjacent to the road at Kandalee. A free bus sponsored by Talison will also take people out to the Kandalee Hill vantage point and return after the cyclists have passed by. This bus will leave the Greenbushes Roadhouse at 9:30am. There will be a coffee van and drinks and snacks for purchase at the Kandalee vantage point. The event carpark will be locked down until around 11am when cyclists have been through.

The event will provide an excellent view of the cyclists as they climb the hill, vying for the title of King and Queen of Kandalee Hill. Take along a streamer or flag to wave the cyclists as they pass by. Cowbells will also be provided for people to ring.

The Tour is Australia's only pro-am cycling event. The 2016 Tour is set to host its largest field of competitors and a large contingent of spectators is expected at the Nannup Stage Start, at Kandalee and again at the finish line in Nannup.

Sponsors of the 2016 event include Tourism WA, Shire of Nannup and Talison Lithium. Talison is sponsoring the Red Sprinter's Jersey.

Silver Metal Clay is a revolutionary new medium from Japan, which allows you to create 99.9% pure silver jewellery. It consists of very small particles of reused silver mixed with an organic binder and water. The metal clay can be moulded, textured, carved and sculpted; it is then fired with a torch or fired in a kiln to transform it into silver. **During this class you will be able to create two to three pieces of jewellery depending on the size and will introduce you to the infinite possibilities of this medium.**

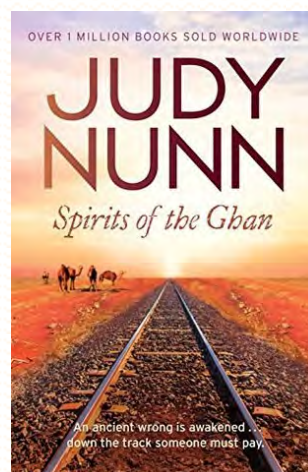

## Attending a job interview? Then you may find these tips handy in helping you secure that next position.....

Positive body language plays a crucial part in every job interview. How you position yourself and how you react to the interview panel's body language can impact on how well you do at job interview. The interview panel is reading and judging your body language from the time you walk into the room, to the time you walk out. They are using your body language to determine confidence, credibility and honesty. This newsletter contains some tips on what to do and what to avoid in the interview that will help you portray a positive image.

### 1. Sit upright in the chair

The best posture is to sit upright with your shoulders up (not slouched) and leaning slightly forward. Peak performance has you sitting on the front 2/3rds of the chair with your back not touching the back of chair. (just think of cellist's or guitarists who sit on the front half of their chair when performing). Sitting slightly forward helps to demonstrate your confidence and enthusiasm for the job and it creates peak physiology.

### 2. Your arms should be relaxed and resting on your lap.

Avoid leaning on the table, folded arms, arms on hips, hands around your face or mouth (can hide your facial expressions). Resting hands on your lap allows you to gesture if you need to and gives a comfortable relaxed look.

### 3. Eye contact.

Eye contact should be direct eye contact with the interview panel and genuine eye contact as if you were speaking to a friend. It is important to treat the interview panel members equally and as you would a normal audience, with eye contact with all of the panel members. Many interviewees make the mistake of only responding to the panel member who has asked the question, ignoring the other 2 or 3 panel members.

### 4. Gestures

Do gesture, but at an interview with a panel of 2 to 4 people, one handed smaller gestures are fine. Don't gesture too large with both hands, as you would in front of 100 people. Also avoid too many gestures, repetitive gestures and hands that just bounce up and down and don't mean anything. Your gestures should support and be consistent with what you are saying.

### 5. Make your body language positive.

This includes leaning forward, smiling and having a positive attitude towards the interview. Do mirror and match the body language of the interview panel, nodding in agreement and smiling when they smile.

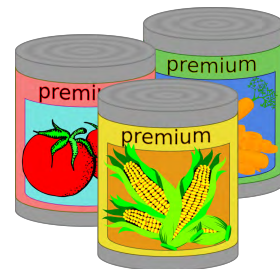
## CRC Coordinator's Column

### MADE IN AUSTRALIA - LABELLING LAWS

As of 1st July 2016 the labelling laws in Australia have changed. The new laws stipulate that the following label guidelines must be met:

- the kangaroo in a triangle symbol so consumers can easily and quickly identify the food's Australian origin
- a statement indicating that the food was grown, produced or made in Australia
- the minimum proportion, by ingoing weight, of Australian ingredients, indicated by a percentage amount and shown in a bar chart.

### Did you know..?

Did you know as a country patient you can attend some of your specialist medical appointments using videoconferencing?

Thanks to telehealth, country outpatients often now have access to specialists via telehealth – using videoconferencing to allow you to have face to face appointments with your doctors without having to visit Perth.

This saves you the time, money and the inconvenience of having to travel long distances for relatively short specialist visits.

The free telehealth service is available for a wide range of clinics including burns, wounds, pain management, speech pathology, gastroenterology, neurology, urology, paediatrics, mental health and many more.

After you've made an appointment, you simply visit your closest telehealth-enabled health service and the staff will connect you via videoconference to your specialist at their Perth hospital.

### Sensational Food at Balingup

Michelle Spargo, Senior Health Promotion Officer for WA Country Health Services South West partnered with the Greenbushes CRC with sponsorship from Foodbank, to present a half-day Healthy Lunch Box workshop at the Balingup Primary School.

Children were split into three groups with the pre-primary and years 1-3 cooking sultana muffins and the years 4-6 taking on the chopping and grating skills to produce a “rainbow salad” and dicer slice.

# Notice of intention to lay 1080 poison

## At Schwenke's Dam and the active mine site, Including South Hampton and Austin's Dams, Greenbushes

**The Blackwood Basin Group and Talison Lithium (or licensed contractor) intend to lay 1080 poison baits at Schwenke's Dam and the active mine site including the Southampton and Austin's Dam areas for the control of foxes. We intend for this program to run for **THREE MONTHS**. Baiting will commence during 26 October 2016 and complete the baiting program 26 January 2017.**

Please be advised that 1080 is highly toxic. The consumption of an animal that has ingested a lethal or sub-lethal dose of 1080 poses a serious risk of secondary poisoning to humans and other species. Taking of carcasses, removal of hides, and shooting or trapping animals (for human or animal consumption) is prohibited during the baiting period and for at least 14 days after the completion of the baiting program.

Please ensure children and other persons in your care are restricted from entering the site of baiting.

Please restrain your pets, working dogs, and stock to avoid the possibility of poisoning through direct baiting or through eating 1080 poisoned animals.

If you would like further information about this proposed baiting program please contact the BBG on the number below. Alternatively, you can speak to a Biosecurity Officer at the Department of Agriculture and Food WA (DAFWA).

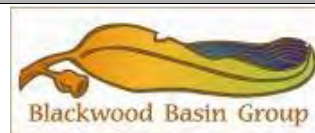

## Dams to Wetlands Workshop

The Dams to Wetlands workshop was held on the 22<sup>nd</sup> October in Greenbushes and we were lucky to get the very knowledgeable Natalee Kuser to speak to us about creating a wetland out of our farm dams.

Natalee took us through the process from land works to habitat creation and all the way to plant selection with particular emphasis on choosing local and local provenance plants as preference. These are plants that have evolved in your specific area. Even though there may be the same plant grown further away, there may be slight genetic variants which mean it is better able to survive and thrive on your property.

After a delicious lunch supplied by Tasty Edibles in Greenbushes we went out to have a look at Schwenkes wetland and Charnley's wetland to see what this information can translate to out in the field.
