New South Wales based Blues Band 19 Twenty, comprised of Kane Demelly, Syd Green and John Gwilliam (pictured above), will provide some atmosphere in the lead up to the finish which happens at Thomson Park and the District Hall in Greenbushes.

Be at Thomson Park from 9:30am onwards to be a part of all the action. The event is free but bring along some cash to purchase food and drinks from the stalls and support our local community groups.

Then on Sunday November 12 the cycling action switches to Balingup where the riders will tackle the Mur de Hay, a twisting tortuous hillside stage where they will be crowned by the Medieval King and Queen upon reaching the top.

Street stalls will again be up for the lunchtime break at the Balingup Village Green before the riders set off on a cycle race back to the Event Village at Nannup, better known as TIGERLAND.

Find a vantage point along the road or make your way to the Stage Finish points to see 750 riders cross the line...many of them the best cyclists in the world.

Marianne Vos will also take time out from the busy cycling schedule to visit the Greenbushes Primary School at 1:20pm on Thursday November 9. Parents and friends and members of the community are welcome to attend and share in the fun.

The chairman of Tianqi Lithium Corporation (51 percent stake holders in Talison Lithium) and a number of guests visited site during October to review progress of our expansion.

WA Museum Sponsorship

Tianqi Corporation Chairman Jiang Weiping and Chief Executive Officer Vivian Wu recently announced a \$5m partnership with the Foundation for the WA Museum.

As part of the partnership the company will fund naming rights to the museum's Tianqi Lithium Connections Gallery and establish the Jiang Weiping Cultural Fund.

The Jiang Weiping Cultural Fund will, over the next decade, assist the museum to bring high calibre international exhibitions to Western Australia.

During his time in Perth in October Mr Jiang launched Western Australia's first Sino-Australia Economic and Trade Forum with partners the University of Western Australia. The forum was the first of what will be a regular event to bring pre-eminent academics in the economics, finance, trade and resource management fields together to discuss new opportunities.

Expansion Project

The CGP2 construction program at Greenbushes is progressing well with the civil earthworks being finalised, piling works over 50% complete and work on concrete footings ramping up. There are currently between 80 and 90 personnel working on the project. The new access for the construction site (gate3) is nearing completion. Once construction is complete this will be the product transport access to and from site.

Please be reminded that burning off is not allowed without a permit as from 1st November 2017.


A reminder that this year's Remembrance Day Service will be held on Friday 10th November 2017 in front of the Cenotaph at 10:45am.

Greenbushes Primary School Update



STEM, Art and Textiles

One of the great things about Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) is that it encompasses so many other learning areas. In our classroom this year we have two cushions that the children use on their seats and recently it became a bit of an issue about whose turn it was to use them. We could have approached this in several ways. 1. Get rid of the cushions, 2. Ask students to bring in a cushion from home or 3. Use this as a learning experience and create cushions for the children to sit on.

We chose 3!

So, the students have started with a piece of hessian and have created a bar code type pattern using wool and tapestry needles. They have begun using contrasting colours to create patterns. As I have explained to them many times, patterns are important and repeated pattern especially. When Kindergarten students thread coloured beads onto string or complete patterns using shapes or colours, this skill is developed to assist with mathematics as mathematics is nothing more than patterns. If we think of the simple counting process there is a pattern to it, multiplication tables, even and odd numbers – all of these are patterns and once students can remember the pattern, use a pattern or conquer how to find the pattern, Mathematics makes a great deal more sense.

Getting back to the Cushion project though, there is a lot of learning and skill acquisition going on here too. Especially in fine motor skills from threading a needle, to tying knots, following established patterns and also experimenting with creating their own patterns. The next stage is to use chain stitch to write their names on a piece of gingham cloth then sew this to the hessian before stuffing it with pillow fill. A bit of experimentation will need to take place to see how much stuffing will be the best fit.

Plant of the Month with Felicity Littleton

Stylidium schoenoides: Common Name: Cow Kicks

I have no information as to why the plant is called "Cow Kicks". Perhaps there was so many of them at one time that cows might tread on them. That being said, Cow Kicks are one of the "Trigger Plants", one of 200 species recognised in the South West. It has a larger flower than most, being a lovely creamy colour. Clearly, because of its size, it is easy to recognise the fascinating "trigger" mechanism.

The trigger mechanism works thus: One of the petals on the flower is modified to form a tiny "labellum" (lip). This acts as a landing platform for a visiting insect. The weight of the insect stimulates the trigger (style) to spring over, dabbing the insect with pollen. Whether the style springs from the side, bottom or top, these directions help us identify the species.

Most Stylidiums are either small herbs or climbers.

Stylidium schoenoides is described as a tufted perennial herb growing between 10 and 20 cms. In height.



The plant flowers from October to December.




