"As a first step we would like to see if any of our local artists are interested in being involved in this project and we would then be looking to apply for grant funding to pay for the art creation and installation," she said.


"We really want to hear from artists who can help us put together a brief and costings for our funding application as we have lots of ideas and just need a designer or artist to help out," said Mrs Henderson.


ARMY VISITS TOWN




MINE NEWS





Notice of intention to lay 1080 poison

At Schwenke's Dam and the active mine site, Including South hampton and Austin's Dams, Greenbushes

The Blackwood Basin Group and Talison Lithium (or licensed contractor) intend to lay 1080 poison baits at Schwenke's Dam and the active mine site including the Southampton and Austin's Dam areas for the control of foxes. We intend for this program to run for THREE MONTHS. Baiting will commence during 6th September 2016 and complete the baiting program 7th December 2016.

Please be advised that 1080 is highly toxic. The consumption of an animal that has ingested a lethal or sub-lethal dose of 1080 poses a serious risk of secondary poisoning to humans and other species. Taking of carcasses, removal of hides, and shooting or trapping animals (for human or animal consumption) is prohibited during the baiting period and for at least 14 days after the completion of the baiting program.

Please ensure children and other persons in your care are restricted from entering the site of baiting. Please restrain your pets, working dogs, and stock to avoid the possibility of poisoning through direct baiting or through eating 1080 poisoned animals.

If you would like further information about this proposed baiting program please contact the BBG on the number below. Alternatively, you can speak to a Biosecurity Officer at the Department of Agriculture and Food WA (DAFWA).

Blackwood Basin Group Update



The Priority Bittern and Waterbird Biodiversity Enhancement Project, coordinated by the Blackwood Basin Group (BBG), is a four year project, funded by the Australian Government, which aims to create a wetland haven at Schwenke's Dam, Greenbushes, to attract critically endangered waterbirds.

New Season, New Beginnings

Some days it may not feel like it but Makuru, the coldest and wettest time of the year, is over. We're now in the middle Djilba. The traditional way of naming and measuring the seasons gives us a good way of tracking what is happening in the bush around us. Djilba is a very transitional time of year with some cold clear days but also some warmer and even sunny days getting more prevalent. The bush is starting to look yellow and cream coloured with the flowering plants, and the birds are calling loudly advertising their status and suitability to be a mate. Keep an eye out for the male Splendid Fairy-Wren showing off his plumage.



Spring Gully

Transformation of Spring Gully site from a bald hill (thanks to some solid weed control) into a Forest, Woodland and Wetlands has begun. The site was direct seeded in June using Talison's seed mix. Plantings have followed with help from the Green Army and St Mary's Catholic Primary School, Boyup Brook. There remains almost 1000 plants to go in, but we'll wait for the water to recede a little before we tackle that.






